

## Art Associates to View Japanese Screens

The art depicted on Japanese folding screens has fascinated Western audiences since the 16th century. Japanese artists have used the screens to unleash their imaginations and to realize their most expansive visions. Often the screens represent career-defining masterpieces; however, because of their size and other transportation difficulties, there have been very few opportunities to see many of these gold-leafed treasures at a single venue. A new exhibition at the Art Institute entitled Beyond Golden Clouds: Japanese Screens from the Art Institute of Chicago and the Saint Louis Art Museum showcases 32 exquisite screens, illustrating the full scope of this exalted medium from the 16th century through today.

Members of the Barrington/Northwest Community Associates will have the opportunity to view these treasures for their first excursion of the 2009-2010 season when they travel to the Art Institute on Wednesday, Sept. 16 from 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. This program, includes transportation, a lecture by Lucas Livingston, assistant director of Senior Programs, and a complimentary coffee hosted by the Women's Board of the Art Institute.

In his discussion, Livingston will explore the variety of media demonstrated in the screens, including traditional examples on paper and silk and more innovative examples of stoneware and lacquer. He will also explain the particular role of screens as functional works of art, focusing on characteristic materials and painting techniques developed as this art medium flour-

## Supreme Court Increases Burden of Proof in Age Discrimination Cases

The U.S. Supreme Court recently held in that the Age Discrimination in Employment Act does not allow a worker to establish discrimination by showing that age was one motivating factor for the employer's action. Instead, the majority held, employees must show that age was the decisive factor behind the employer's adverse job action. In Gross v. FBL Financial Services, Inc., 129 S.Ct. 2343 (2009). 54-year-old Gross was a claims administration director until he was reassigned to the position of claims project administrator. Many of his previous duties were transferred to the newly-created position awarded to an employee in her early 40s, who Gross once supervised. Gross saw this as a demotion and sued the employer for age discrimination under ADEA. The jury returned a verdict Gross but the appellate court overturned the jury verdict and instructed that age discrimination must presented with direct evidence sufficient to support a finding by a reasonable fact finder that an illegitimate criterion actually motivated the adverse employment action. The U.S. Supreme Court considered whether a plaintiff must present direct evidence of discrimination in order to obtain a "mixed-motive" jury instruction in a non-Title VII discrimination case. The Supreme Court held that the statutory language of Title VII is ma-

terially different than the ADEA. Unlike



Title VII, the ADEA does not authorize a "mixed-motive" cause of action. Instead. the ADEA makes it unlawful for an employer to make an adverse employment decision "because of" an employee's age. The Supreme Court interpreted "because of" to mean that age must be the determining factor in a decision.

We all know that with aging often comes the advantages of being wiser and calmer. However, it also comes with a flurry of ever-increasing drawbacks. Besides sagging from head to toe, our vision, hearing, manual dexterity, and strength also go downhill. Those who have kept up with their dental hygiene significantly through the years may be encountering many problems as they age. These problems sometimes result from poor oral hygiene, medications, waiting to seek care until the pain sets in, and infrequent trips to the dentist. We see it! A patient, whose mouth is very well restored, suddenly is facing bad breath, gum disease, cavities at root surfaces, and recurring decay under good restorations such as crowns or fillings. Some may even have painful abscesses. Medications which can severely dry out the mouth and predispose to these problems, frequently add insult to injury! 



## Dr. James Baird Addresses **Common Foot Problems**

As summer winds down and we fall back into the routine of school days, now is a good time to address the foot pain that you have been dealing with. Dr. James Baird is a local Podiatric Physician and Surgeon and is ready to help. Here are a few suggestions from Dr. Baird to alleviate some common foot problems.

My son has started football and he has been complaining of heel pain. He does not remember any event that would have brought this on. What could be the cause of his pain?

Most likely your son has developed an injury called calcaneal apophysitis or Sever's disease. It is most common between the ages of 8 and 14. Pain is usually felt at the back and side of the heel. Squeezing the sides of the heel bone is often painful. The pain is usually relieved by rest, and running and jumping usually make the pain worse. A recent growth spurt or weight gain can also trigger heel pain. The usual treatment for the condition involves cutting back on activity, avoiding going barefoot, performing calf stretches, icing the area after activity, and wearing a supportive shoe with a well padded heel and heel lift. It is best to have this condition evaluated by a physician for accurate diagnosis and treatment.

I am a teacher preparing to go back to school and I am already dreading my dress shoes. Is there anything I can do to make my feet feel better during the

General foot aches and pains are usually caused by poor shoe selection. The first thing to do is to make sure you are wearing the proper size shoe. Most people wear shoes a half to a full size to small. Our feet swell during the day, so always go shoe shopping at the end of the day when your feet are largest. Make sure the shoe has good stability. This means you should not be able to easily bend the shoe in half. Pick a shoe that bends where our feet bend, at the toes, not the arch. If you have specific spots of pain, such as the ball of the foot or the heel, a special insert made for your dress shoes may help decrease the discomfort in these areas.






