



Dear St. Anne parishioners and friends,

It is only in giving and sharing God's gifts generously – only by opening our hearts to the ultimate gift of love – that WE are renewed. All of us are led by the ONE, the Lord Jesus, who gives everything for all!

There is one thing that we must all know and it is around this that I have centered my ministry as your pastor for these last 20 years.

I have shared this poem with you before and I have again on this Easter. It continues to be a wondrous gift that I believe all of us must discover again and again.

*I have been weak; others have been my strength...*

*I have been foolish; others have led me to wisdom...*

*I have been lonely; others have shared their lives with me...*

*I have doubted; others have given me their conviction...*

*I have been cynical; others have renewed my ideals...*

*I have been self-centered; others have shown me the generosity of their dreams...*

*I have been without love; others have opened their hearts to me...*

*I have scorned my humanity; others have shown me that to be human is the gift of God...*

In all critical moments of our lives, we have been led again and again by *community* to the story of the God who is Lord and brother, and we have come to know that all of us are led by His SPIRIT! The great potential of the human family is always being revealed by the God of love! To come to Christ in his suffering and in his victory is to find life.

May we share Easter as a faith-filled community.

May we live as households of faith!

## GENERATIONS OF FAITH

**Dr. Jerry Galipeau**

Wednesday\* and Monday Night Speaker

Dr. Jerry Galipeau received rave reviews when he was the guest speaker for the session on the Sacrament of Eucharist in October. I am pleased to announce that he is returning as our speaker for the Monday night **Generations of Faith** session on April 20th, starting at 7:00 p.m., to discuss the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation. Dr. Galipeau is Associate Publisher at World Library Publications, the music and liturgy division of J.S. Paluch Company, in Franklin Park, Illinois. Before coming to World Library, he served for fifteen years as Director of Liturgy and Music at parishes in Florida and Illinois. Jerry presents keynotes and workshops throughout the United States and Canada on the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, liturgical spirituality, ritual music, evangelization, and adult spiritual formation. Besides presenting at **Generations of Faith**, St. Anne parishioners have been fortunate enough to have heard Jerry speak several years ago at the Parish Mission as well as at the adult education Lenten program of FOCUS.

\* In order that those with children who are unable to attend the Monday night session can also hear a professional theologian, **Dr. Galipeau will also speak on the evening of Wednesday, April 15th.**

## MINISTRY OPPORTUNITIES

At **Generations of Faith**, we come together to share a meal and then to share our traditions and our faith. We come away refreshed and enriched by the experience. This cannot happen without the help of many dedicated ministers giving their time, talents and efforts to their fellow parishioners. 

## **The Easter Call to Us**

This weekend we celebrate the greatest of all Church feast days. As we recall in our imagination the story of Easter, we are invited to relive the scene of that experience of Jesus and those who witnessed his Resurrection. The earth itself was quaking as the women approached the tomb. A mighty messenger of the Lord descended and effortlessly rolled back the stone that was designed to seal the grave. The women arrived at the once place of death and found the messenger radiantly alive and dazzling, giving a message that was to dispel all fear. The women discovered a tomb that was shattered by the power of life, and their lives and the lives of all of us were forever changed by this discovery.

With hearts no longer fearful but overjoyed, the women received a task, a mission to deliver the good news to all the disciples that the tomb could not contain the Lord of Love. They were sent to deliver the Good News that the Lord was risen.

In all its solemnity with universal symbols of water, light, fire, bread and wine, its proclamation of the Scriptures, its music, preaching and prayers, Easter is designed to instill an awareness of the Lord in our lives and the mission we are each called to perform. As was the mission of the women, we are reminded to carry the news of the Risen Lord's triumph to one another and to the world.

The beautiful symbols and experiences of Easter are also meant to instill in us a sense of our own purpose and importance. Even in the face of personal trials and grief, Easter is meant to teach us a peace that can come from the Lord alone. Easter asks us to be prepared to accept a mission that can forever change our destiny and that of our families. We should not be surprised that, if we listen attentively, we will hear the Risen Lord speak the word of peace, *Shalom*, a word that will still every fear and bring us steadfast strength as we go about our daily lives.

Let us speak that peace – and be that peace – to our world. Happy Easter!

## **Pope John Paul II's Homily on the first universal celebration of Divine Mercy Sunday, 2001.**

**DIVINE MERCY: THE EASTER GIFT** "Fear not, I am the first and the last, and the living one; I died, and behold I am alive for evermore." (Rev 1:17-18). We heard these comforting words in the Second Reading taken from the Book of Revelation. They invite us to turn our gaze to Christ, to experience His reassuring presence. To each person, whatever his condition, even if it were the most complicated and dramatic, the Risen One repeats: "Fear not! I died on the Cross but now I am alive for evermore;" "I am the first and the last, and the living one."

"The first," that is, the source of every being and the first-fruits of the new creation; "the last," the definitive end of history; "the living one," the inexhaustible source of life that triumphed over death forever.

In the Messiah, crucified and risen, we recognize the features of the Lamb sacrificed on Golgotha, who implores forgiveness for His torturers and opens the gates of heaven to repentant sinners; we glimpse the face of the immortal King who now has "the keys of Death and Hades." (Rev 1:18)

Give thanks to the Lord, for He is good; for His mercy endures forever! (Ps 117:1) Let us make our own the psalmist's exclamation which we sang in the Responsorial Psalm: "The Lord's mercy endures forever!" In order to understand thoroughly the truth of these words, let us be led by the liturgy to the heart of the event of salvation, which unites Christ's Death and Resurrection with our lives and with the world's history. This miracle of mercy has radically changed humanity's destiny. It is a miracle in which is unfolded the fullness of the love of the Father who, for our redemption, does not even draw back before the sacrifice of His Only-begotten Son.

In the humiliated and suffering Christ, believers and non-believers can admire a surprising solidarity, which binds Him to our human condition beyond all imaginable measure. The Cross, even after the Resurrection of the Son of God, "speaks and never ceases to speak of God the Father, who is absolutely faithful to His eternal love for man. ...Believing in this love means believing in mercy." (Rich in Mercy, 7)

Let us thank the Lord for His love, which is stronger than death and sin. It is revealed and put into practice as mercy in our daily lives, and prompts every person in turn to have "mercy" towards the Crucified One. Is not loving God and loving one's neighbor and even one's "enemies," after Jesus' example, the program of life of every baptized person and of the whole Church?

**A GREAT JOY** With these sentiments, we are celebrating the Second Sunday of Easter, which since last year, the year of the Great Jubilee, is also called "Divine Mercy Sunday." It is a great joy for me to be able to join all of you, dear pilgrims and faithful who have come from various nations to commemorate, after one year, the canonization of Sr. Faustina Kowalska, witness and messenger of the Lord's merciful love.

The elevation to the honors of the altar of this humble religious, a daughter of my land, is not only a gift for Poland but for all humanity. Indeed the message she brought is the appropriate and incisive answer that God wanted to offer to the questions and expectations of human beings in our time, marked by terrible tragedies. Jesus said to Sr. Faustina one day: "Mankind will not have peace until it turns with trust to My mercy." (Diary, 300) Divine Mercy! This is the Easter gift that the Church receives from the risen Christ and offers to humanity at the dawn of the third millennium.

The Gospel, which has just been proclaimed, helps us to grasp the full sense and value of this gift. The Evangelist John makes us share in the emotion felt by the Apostles in their meeting with Christ after His Resurrection. Our attention focuses on the gesture of the Master, who transmits to the fearful, astounded disciples the mission of being ministers of Divine Mercy. He shows them His hands and His side, which bear the marks of the Passion, and tells them: "As the Father has sent Me, even so I send you." (Jn 20:21)

Immediately afterwards, "He breathed on them, and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained.'" (Jn 20:22-23) Jesus entrusted to them the gift of "forgiving sins," a gift that flows from the wounds in His hands, His feet, and especially from His pierced side. From there a wave of mercy is poured out over all humanity.

Let us relive this moment with great spiritual intensity. Today the Lord also shows us His glorious wounds and His Heart, an inexhaustible source of light and truth, of love and forgiveness.

**THE HEART OF CHRIST!** His "Sacred Heart" has given men everything: redemption, salvation, sanctification. Saint Faustina Kowalska saw coming from this Heart that was overflowing with generous love, two rays of light which illuminated the world.

The two rays, [according to what Jesus Himself told her], denote blood and water. (Diary, 299) The blood recalls the sacrifice of Golgotha and the mystery of the Eucharist; the water, according to the rich symbolism of the Evangelist John, makes us think of Baptism and the Gift of the Holy Spirit. (See Jn 3:5; 4:14)

Through the mystery of this wounded Heart, the restorative tide of God's merciful love continues to spread over the men and women of our time. Here alone can those who long for true and lasting happiness find its secret.

**"JESUS, I TRUST IN YOU!"** This prayer, dear to so many of the devout, clearly expresses the attitude with which we too would like to abandon ourselves trustfully in Your hands, O Lord, our only Savior.

You are burning with the desire to be loved and those in tune with the sentiments of Your Heart learn how to build the new civilization of love. A simple act of abandonment is enough to overcome the barriers of darkness and sorrow, of doubt and desperation. The rays of Your Divine Mercy restore hope, in a special way, to those who feel overwhelmed by the burden of sin.

*Mary, Mother of Mercy, help us always to have this trust in your Son, our Redeemer. Help us, too, St. Faustina, whom we remember today with special affection. Fixing our weak gaze on the divine Savior's face, we would like to repeat with you: "Jesus, I trust in You!" Now and forever. Amen.*



# Sharing the Living Story

## **EASTER SUNDAY, 2009 (42ABC)**

First Reading: **Acts 10:34a, 37-43** (USCCB)

- <sup>34</sup> Peter proceeded to speak and said,  
"You know <sup>37</sup> what has happened all over Judea,  
beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John preached,  
<sup>38</sup> how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power.  
He went about doing good and healing all those oppressed by the devil, for God was with him.  
<sup>39</sup> "We are witnesses of all that he did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem.  
They put him to death by hanging him on a tree.  
<sup>40</sup> This man God raised on the third day and granted that he be visible,  
<sup>41</sup> not to all the people, but to us,  
the witnesses chosen by God in advance, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the  
dead.  
<sup>42</sup> "He commissioned us to preach to the people and testify that he is the one appointed by God  
as judge of the living and the dead.  
<sup>43</sup> To him all the prophets bear witness, that everyone who believes in him  
will receive forgiveness of sins through his name."

Responsorial Psalm 118:1-2, 16-17, 22-23

*This is the day the LORD has made; let us rejoice and be glad.*

Second Reading: **1 Corinthians 5:6b-8** (USCCB)

Brothers and sisters:

- <sup>6</sup> Do you not know that a little yeast leavens all the dough?  
<sup>7</sup> Clear out the old yeast, so that you may become a fresh batch of dough,  
inasmuch as you are unleavened.  
For our paschal lamb, Christ, has been sacrificed.  
<sup>8</sup> Therefore let us celebrate the feast,  
not with the old yeast, the yeast of malice and wickedness,  
but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth.

**Gospel: John 20:1-9** (USCCB)

- <sup>1</sup> On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning,  
while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb.  
<sup>2</sup> So she ran and went to Simon Peter  
and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them,  
"They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him."  
<sup>3</sup> So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb.  
<sup>4</sup> They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter  
and arrived at the tomb first;  
<sup>5</sup> he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in.  
<sup>6</sup> When Simon Peter arrived after him,  
he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there,  
<sup>7</sup> and the cloth that had covered his head,  
not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place.  
<sup>8</sup> Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first,  
and he saw and believed.  
<sup>9</sup> For they did not yet understand the scripture that he had to rise from the dead.

## Sharing the Living Story

*This is the day the Lord has made;  
let us rejoice and be glad.*

Once again the psalm refrain of the day (above) gives the clue to the integrity among all of the four readings. What is it that we should rejoice about on this day of days? Christ is not dead; he is alive. He is not in the tomb; he is raised! He is not what we thought he was; he is glorified, resurrected, not simply alive again. In other words, the categories we used to think in are now gone and we must think in new ways; *not with the old yeast . . . but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth* (Second Reading above).<sup>1</sup>

Yet, is it not we who must have died to former ways, ways that were bound to the old system of thinking? Luke is strong in making this point as he tells the story of Peter preaching to the **gentiles** of Cornelius' household just before their conversion (First Reading above). Jesus *is lord of all*, not just of the Chosen. And we who are witnesses, who have reflected on what he did in bringing *us* through the darkness of this Lent, are now chosen to be witnesses, to speak, to testify, about whom The Christ was for us during our journey and who he can be for others whom we have yet to encounter.

God is at work again. *This is the day the Lord has made . . .* John, the gospel writer, again uses his favorite device: Mary of Magdala comes to the tomb *while it was still dark*; John's darkness is always darkness of spirit – a state of unknowing. She thinks someone has stolen the body!<sup>2</sup> But note how the characters and their relationship in this story also point toward a fading of the old systems of thinking. Mary, under a wrong impression, runs to tell the leadership (Peter and the Beloved Disciple) that the Lord is missing. Peter and the Beloved Disciple run back; the latter arrives first but defers to Peter; Peter goes in first but apparently remains in the "dark." It is the other one, the Beloved Disciple, arriving last, who sees and believes (v.8). Yet they still don't fully get it (v.9). It is the woman, Mary Magdalene, to whom John gives precedence. (See the next story, vv.11 ff.) It is she to whom the Christ, the resurrected Jesus, first appears; it is she whom the Christ mandates to go to his brothers and tell them of the coming ascension. Think of it, John's insistence in positioning Mary is very remarkable in the face of his patriarchal society. But it is clear: **the old categories are to be erased, and new ways of thinking must now be used, . . .let us rejoice and be glad.**

**So What?** What is it that stirs in us this Easter? Can new ways of thinking result from the readings and preaching and Mass prayers over the next seven weeks of Easter?<sup>3</sup> Or will the old categories continue to dictate who we are and therefore, how we will act toward family, friends, those with whom we work, those whom we do not even know? To push this question even more...what does this new life ask of **us** as we continue the attempt to stabilize Iraq, Afghanistan and Pakistan?

Over the next weeks, stay close to the stories of the risen Jesus, The Christ, as the Lectionary<sup>4</sup> depicts his appearance to the newly chosen of God.

### FOOTNOTES:

<sup>1</sup> Ancient bread makers recognize this metaphor. New bread is made from freshly prepared dough, not from previous batch or starter dough; it was therefore unleavened bread (see the Jewish Feast of Unleavened Bread) because it did not yet contain yeast cells from the ambient air.

<sup>2</sup> Grave robbing was a common problem then; heavy penalties were imposed if the desecrators were caught.

<sup>3</sup> This period of eight weeks from Easter Sunday through Pentecost is called the time of mystagogia, when the **Church**, and its newest members – those baptized, confirmed and eucharized at the Easter Vigil, along with those of other Christian traditions who were also confirmed and eucharized that night – ponder the catechesis arising out of the Paschal mystery.

<sup>4</sup> Lectionary: the Church's collection of portions of scripture selected to form a cohesive sense during a given liturgy and during seasons of the Church year.

### Sacramental Celebrations

We believe that the celebration of the sacraments ranks among the most important gifts that we have. We look forward to sharing these celebrations with those who, in some way, are part of our community. Therefore, please note the following:

**Baptism:** Registration in the parish is a prerequisite. For those parents who are baptizing their first child, please allow 2 to 3 months in order to attend 2 required Baptism sessions *before* setting the Baptism date. For a subsequent child's baptism, an interview session must be scheduled prior to setting the date. All schedules are done in the parish office. Please call 847.382.5300.

**Marriage:** A child of a registered parishioner or a registered and active parishioner must schedule an interview with a parish staff person to set a date and start the marriage process. Please call 847.382.5300.

**First Eucharist and First Reconciliation:** These sacraments are celebrated in the second grade. Candidates must complete the required preparation program. Please call the REP office at 847.620.3068.

**Confirmation:** This sacrament is celebrated in high school. Candidates must be registered parishioners and complete the required preparation program. Please call 847.620.3072.
