



Week III FOCUS: Air

From Earth Day, April 22nd through Pentecost, May 23rd, Faithjustice asks parishioners to take time to PRAY, LEARN, ASSESS, ACT and ADVOCATE for creation.

It is important to remember that we do not merely live within our environment as we live within a building. We are part of it, and it is part of us. The world flows through us as breath and blood and food. We are not disinterested bystanders but participants in the wondrous working of nature. We did not leave the web of life; we are strands within it. We may be able to discover and direct the laws of nature, but we are still subject to them. We may be able to control these laws, but we cannot alter them. If we are to live and grow, to think and decide and dream, we must remember that God made a covenant with the entire natural world. We participate in this covenant; we are not separate from it. Indeed: “The Lord’s are the earth

and its fullness; the world and those who dwell in it” (Ps 24:1).

We wish to emphasize the need for personal conversion and responsibility. In our pastoral reflection *Renewing the Earth*, we wrote the following: “Grateful for the gift of creation ... we invite Catholics and men and women of good will in every walk of life to consider with us the moral issues raised by the environmental crisis. ... These are matters of powerful urgency and major consequence. They constitute an exceptional call to conversion. As individuals, as institutions, as a people, we need a change of heart to preserve and protect the

planet for our children and for generations yet unborn.” Each of us should carefully consider our choices and lifestyles. We live in a culture that prizes the consumption of material goods. While the poor often have too little, many of us can be easily caught up in a frenzy of wanting more and more – a bigger home, a larger car, etc. Even though energy resources literally fuel our economy and provide a good quality of life, we need to ask about ways we can conserve energy, prevent pollution, and live more simply.

AN INVITATION TO REFLECTION

Prudence calls the Church to engage in the issue of global climate change for the common good. In the words of Pope Benedict, prudence is the virtue that “tells us what needs to be done today in view of what might happen tomorrow.” The Church’s efforts promote prudent action to address the

growing impact of global climate change and pursue the common good in a very polarized debate.

The bishops’ primary concern within the current public debate is to place the needs of the poor and vulnerable at the center of climate legislation. Both at home and abroad, the poor

contribute the least to climate change but are likely to suffer its worst consequences.

Assess: How much of my driving is “unnecessary?” Do I really have to use a gas-powered leaf blower or other gas-powered tools? What about other gas-powered toys (such as ATVs)?

Act: Carpool rather than going solo. Take public transportation. Combine errands to cut down on trips in the car. Use people-powered tools rather than gas-powered ones. Maintain proper air pressure in your car’s tires: cars with low tire pressure get lower mileage.

Advocate: Help organize a parish or neighborhood Green Committee to help build understanding and acceptance of environmental risks and challenges.



At this, our last **Generations of Faith** event for this year, we address spirituality in our lives. We have seen how prayer enhances our spirituality; now how do we nourish it during the course of day-to-day life? In the busyness of the day, wherever and however that day is spent, what role does our spirituality play? **Please select your sessions online by Sunday, May 9th.**

ADULT SPEAKERS

We are especially pleased to welcome our **Pastor, Fr. Bernie Pietrzak**, as the adult breakout leader at the sessions on Monday through Thursday as well as the Saturday session. Father Bernie was ordained as a priest for the Archdiocese of Chicago in 1981. He served as an associate pastor at St. Victor in Calumet City, Holy Cross Church in Deerfield, and Holy Spirit Parish in Schaumburg. During his years as an associate, he served as a Director of Liturgy, a Director of Adult Formation, and as a chaplain for Marriage Encounter, Young Adult Ministry in the northwest suburbs and for the Jewish – Catholic Dialogue Group for Engaged and Young Married Couples. Before joining us at Saint Anne, Father Bernie was the pastor of Saint Raymond de Penafort Church in Mount Prospect for over thirteen years. Throughout his priesthood, Father Bernie has guided Parish Missions, facilitated parish staff days and served as Spiritual Director for over 30 *Christ Renews His Parish* retreat weekends. Besides serving as our pastor, Father Bernie is currently one of the Archdiocesan Deans in Vicariate I.

Spiritan priest **Anthony J. Gittins, CSSp**, will be the presenter at the evening adult breakout on **Friday, May 21st**. Fr. Gittins is in his 26th year at the Catholic Theological Union in Chicago, is currently Professor of Theological Anthropology and is also the Bishop Ford M.M. Professor of Mission. Born in Manchester, England, he earned an MA and PhD from the University of Edinburgh, Scotland. He has taught and worked in over 30 countries. His pastoral outreach includes ministry in cultures from Africa to the Pacific, and work with Chicago's disenfranchised, especially homeless women. Fr. Gittins' commitment to homeless women in Chicago, whose stories he told in the book *“Where There's Hope, There's Life: Women's Stories of Homelessness and Survival,”* is ongoing. He is the author of fifteen books and numerous articles. Other recent books include *“Ministry At the Margins: Strategy and Spirituality for Mission”* (Orbis, 2002) and *“Come, Follow Me: Invitations to Discipleship”* (Liguori, 2004). Father Gittins also lectures and leads retreats both nationally and internationally. He continues his anthropological work by spending periods of time in local churches, especially in Africa and the Central Pacific, working on enculturation by bringing teachings from cultural anthropology and theology together. He has an adopted, multi-ethnic family in Chicago.

ARE YOU SAVED?

"Are you saved?" That is one of the classic questions often asked as we open our door to an evangelist making his or her way down the street on a quiet afternoon. Then there are the follow-up questions: "Are you born again?" "Do you accept Jesus Christ as your personal Lord and Savior?" You know them all very well. Your answer probably is "of course!" However, that may not be the answer they are asking of you because their view may be quite different than yours.

Jesus tells us clearly in the gospel that all people can be saved. The gate is open with no entry fee and no cover charge. There are no restrictions, bribes or guards. You will not need a visa, passport, permit and any other identification.

We are saved, but an author once said, "...that demands some effort on our part to remain that way." Clearly we are told that the Lord knows our works, our thoughts, what we are doing, but at the same time, God sends a sign among us so that we may better see God's will and his glory. Often the signs are people. It is our task to listen to his people who are his signs among us.

God speaks to us through many avenues and peoples. It can be the homilist at Mass, our family and friends, the people we meet at work, the cashier and salesperson or the bank teller. It may be the person we least expect and who surprises us with some experience in our lives. We just need to be attuned to these people whom God sends in our midst.

We need to know how to respond to or discover the Lord in our lives. We need to know who are the ones who can teach and lead us, who give us good example. Therefore, we need to be men and women of prayer who read and meditate on the word of God. But, as many of us heard at the *Generations of Faith* session on Prayer, it is more than *knowing all about* the Lord. We must have a communication, a *relationship with* the Lord. We need to communicate with Jesus on a daily basis, be witnesses to his presence among us. Let us continually work on that relationship. Let us get to know Jesus better so that he will know us better. Then we will truly be "born again" in the Lord!


May Dinner



Sharing the Living Story

5TH SUNDAY OF EASTER, 2010 (54C)

Acts 14: 21-27

- ²¹ After Paul and Barnabas had proclaimed the good news to that city and made a considerable number of disciples, they returned to Lystra and to Iconium and to Antioch.
- ²² They strengthened the spirits of the disciples and exhorted them to persevere in the faith, saying, "It is necessary for us to undergo many hardships to enter the kingdom of God."
- ²³ They appointed elders for them in each church and, with prayer and fasting, commended them to the Lord in whom they had put their faith.
- ²⁴ Then they traveled through Pisidia and reached Pamphylia.
- ²⁵ After proclaiming the word at Perga they went down to Attalia.
- ²⁶ From there they sailed to Antioch, where they had been commended to the grace of God for the work they had now accomplished.
- ²⁷ And when they arrived, they called the church together and reported what God had done with them and how he had opened the door of faith to the Gentiles.

Sharing the Living Story

At 13:1, John opens his description of the Last Supper: *Before the feast of Passover, Jesus knew that his hour had come to pass from this world to the Father. Having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end.* John is graphic: foot washing is to be the hallmark of discipleship; there is nothing about the breaking of the bread, no sharing of the cup; Jesus washes their feet then says, *I have given you a model to follow, so that as I have done for you, you should also do* (v.15).

Verses 31-32 is a leave-taking; 31b seems clear: *... and God is glorified in him* (him = Jesus); 32b proclaims: *... God will also glorify him* (Jesus) *in himself* (God) *and will glorify him at once* (passion, death, resurrection and ascension all follow directly ahead). John previously announced this at 12:23 – *the hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified ... unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies it produces much fruit.* (But see below under **honor/shame**.)

Finally, in vv. 33a-35, John's Jesus gives a *new commandment*. This seems to be related to a kind of covenant love that is nuanced differently from the covenant love in the Hebrew Scriptures. John describes Jesus as emphasizing in the Final Discourse a kind of love that has to do with intimacy, indwelling, and mutual knowledge (I know mine and mine know me!) The ultimate is: *As I have loved you, so you also should love one another.* John is crystal clear to his community: the One whom we say we follow is asking that we love one another even to the point of laying down our lives for one another just as he has done for us; if we manifest this kind of love, everyone will understand that we are indeed *his* intimate friends. The witness, the testimony, of the community of Jesus' friends is therefore to be THE way that the world will continue to encounter Jesus until he comes again. It is sounded clearly at 17:22ff when Jesus prays for those who will come to believe in him through the witness of his friends: *... so that they may be one, as we are one, I in them and you in me, that they may be brought to perfec-*

tion as one, that the world may know that you sent me, and that you loved them even as you loved me. (But see this whole prayer of Jesus at chapter 17; it is most beautiful).

Recall that **honor/shame** is the core value in Mediterranean culture; it requires that honor be a public claim to worth but with the accompanying public acknowledgment of that claim. **Moderns must look through their lenses to see as they do.** Here, John shows Jesus as claiming the honor of being an obedient son by willingly laying down his life in response to his Father (10:17, *For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it up again. I have received this command from my Father.* In turn, note that the Father is honored by the Son's obedience even unto death. John shows the Father's great claim to honor is in raising Jesus from the dead since this completely reverses the shame (loss of honor) of the ignoble death by crucifixion; God did not abandon his only begotten Son (a just person) to perpetual shame but, instead, bestowed on him an honor that no one could counter or deny: God raised him from the dead. This is ultimate glory.

Western concepts of honor seem different. In business, we see corporate chiefs who by contract are given enormous "golden parachutes" despite their inept mishandling of their responsibility to care for the company and its shareholders. We make such heroes of sport figures, yet they seem to flout ethics and the rules of the game. Our culture accepts the adversarial concept in its courts to the extent that those who have lost honor are expected to take their case there for judgment; a Timothy McVeigh has his day in court. In Mediterranean **honor/shame** terms, these are unacceptable; in fact, using an attorney and going to court is in itself shameful and is an admission that the challenge to one's honor is not only very great but is insurmountable.

So What? In our own culture, how do we understand Jesus' command to love one another as he had loved us? Just who is *one another*? For example, what do we make of the contention that there are those "poor" who deserve our works of mercy and then there are those "poor" who do not deserve anything of ours.

In contrast, look at the breadth of God's justice described in verses 8 – 9 of the psalm for today. The dominion of God extends through time and space; the psalmist sings thus of God:

*The LORD is gracious and merciful,
slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love.
The LORD is good to all,
and his compassion is over all that he has made.*

In whose image **are** we made? Perhaps our only response is:

I will praise your name forever, my king and my God.






