Ten Secrets To Having Your Children Photographed

Parents are often unaware of all there is to know when having their children's portraits made. Understanding what to look for, will insure your child a very successful photo-

graphic session. Keep in mind the following points.

1. Research photographers. It's not enough to call on the phone. You must go to see the photographer's work. You will notice vast differences in the style and quality of individual photographers. Your photographer should insist on a pre-portrait consultation. 2. It is important not to prime your children before their session. A conscientious photographer will want to work with your child from a level playing field...meaning the child should not be anticipating anything. This will avoid cheezy or fake looking expressions.

3. Decide on a location to hang your portrait first. Knowing this will guide you as to

the clothing style, color and mood of the portrait.

4. Measuring the size of this display space will help determine if the portrait should be a closeup, half or full length.

5. Be certain your child is not sick, hungry or overly tired for the session. It's important that children feel good in order to look good. Don't let a photographer talk you into coming in anyway if your child is under the weather. Simply reschedule.



College-Bound Students: Build Strong Study Skills for School Success

In addition to the excitement of meeting half-hour, your learning curve deteriorates new people and experiencing a new environment, students also have to face greater academic responsibility in college. If you manage your time properly and marshal your resources, you may wind up with better grades and more free time.


First, take a look at your study time. How often do you study? When do you do it? How much time do you spend at it? If you know you're not making the most of your free time, spend a few weeks logging all daily plans and activities. On one chart, list how you intend to use every hour of every day. On the other chart, record what you actually did. It can be a rude awakening to realize how much time you spend doing nothing. Work out a compromise schedule to recoup these little bits of lost time.


Take great notes in class. Many students either try to take too many notes and write down everything, or else they think it's common sense, don't write it down, and then can't recall it later. The Necessity of a Will

Happy New Year! I hope you all had a healthy and peaceful holiday season. I was fortunate to spend the holidays with family and friends that live in many parts of the country. We had a wonderful reunion in California.

I am asked time and again about the necessity to have a will and what is involved if someone wants to change a will or create a trust. A will is a person's revocable (it can be changed) document that provides for the transfer of property at death. The person names an executor to carry out his/her desires. Wills have been around since the first days of recorded history. Archaeologists have found 4,500 year old hieroglyphics in Egyptian tombs that state the wishes of the authors to leave property to others.

What you put in a will depends on what property you have, to whom you want it to be distributed and the dynamics of your family, etc. There are several elements that must be present to create a valid will. 1) You must be of legal age to make a will; 2) You must be of sound mind and memory, which means that you should know what you are executing; 3) The will should have provisions that dispose of your property; 4) The will must be voluntarily signed by the testator unless unable to do so, in which case you can allow a lawyer or witness to sign for you; 5) The will must be witnessed; 6) The will must be attested to which means that it contains a statement at the end that it is your will, the date and place of signing, and the fact that you signed it in the presence of the witnesses who then also signed it in your presence.

Wills may also be changed during your life. However, this requires following the laws of the state in which you reside. The following case history illustrates this point. Two sisters removed a safe from the home of their brother approximately eight hours after his death and transferred it to one of their homes. With the help of their husbands, they broke open the safe and discovered a will. The will had named another party as beneficiary to a substantial amount of property. However, the bequests to this third party were questioned because the brother's name, initials a date and the word "void"



appeared wherever the third party's name was mentioned. The sisters objected to the will (they presumably would receive more through intestacy-probate of an estate without a will). Their objection was based on the mutilated condition of the will, since every reference to the man was

The court ruled that the will was not void. It was not revoked and the will was admitted to probate and the bequests to the third party were allowed to stand. Powers v. Lancey, 671 N.E. 2d 1215 (1996). Under Illinois law a will may be revoked by l) burning, canceling, tearing, or obliterating it, by the testator himself or by some person in his presence and by his direction and consent; or 2) by the execution of a later will declaring the revocation; or 3) by a later will to the extent it is inconsistent with the prior will; or 4) by the execution of an instrument declaring the revocation and meeting, all the statutory formalities. The mere writing upon a will in insufficient to obliterate or cancel the will, even though the writing may express an intention to revoke or cancel. 755 ILCS 5/4-7.

When drafting or revising a will it is important to know the law to ensure that your intentions are carried out by and for those of your choosing.


A Friend in Need or Angels in Disguise by Judy Kaplan, MS


