

will manage booths downtown.


Lunch time appetites will be satisfied by all kinds of food as local restaurateurs man booths on the sidewalks.



Ruby was named because of its red color (Latin rubeus). The color ranges from medium to light red to dark tones of red to purple-red. Stones that are light to very light pink are properly called pink sapphires.

The finest rubies are found in Burma and are commonly called "Pigeons' blood." The oldest sources are Burma and Sri Lanka. The leading source of ruby today is Thailand and others include Afghanistan, India, Kenya and Tanzania.

Ruby is the hardest mineral after diamond (9 on Mohs' scale and 10 for diamond), although only 1/140th as hard. It is seven times as hard as topaz, the next on Mohs' scale; however, the hardness varies in different directions. Ruby is commonly heat treated to improve the red color and the overall appearance.

**Cartilage Implantation—
 for Damaged Knees**

**Dr. Martin L. Saltzman Announces a New Innovative
 Technique for People with Knee Cartilage Damage**

Three Step Process:

- Arthroscopic surgery to obtain sample of healthy cartilage.
- Healthy cartilage cells multiplied approximately 15 times.
- Implant new cartilage in to injured area to produce a durable joint surface.

More than 500,000 people in the United States suffer injuries to the cartilage in their knees every year, resulting in disability and pain. Since cartilage does not heal by itself, the debilitating effects can last a lifetime. Cartilage is a tissue in the joints that cushions the bones. When cartilage is damaged, the bones begin to grate against each other. Previously, patients suffering from knee cartilage injuries would be candidate's for a total knee replacement procedure.

"Being able to "grow" a patient's own cartilage cells and then successfully implant them into an injured knee is a real medical breakthrough," states Dr. Saltzman. "Many of the patients who have shown long-term benefits because of this procedure were injured while participating in sports or at work. Pain and loss of mobility is difficult for anyone, but especially for those who are accustomed to a very active lifestyle. My goal is to help patients with specific knee injuries regain mobility and return to optimal function."

In a three step process, **Dr. Saltzman** performs Arthroscopic surgery to obtain a tiny sample of healthy cartilage from a patient's injured knee. This sample is then sent to the laboratory where the car-

tilage is grown, increasing the number of cells approximately 15 times. The patient then undergoes a second surgical procedure several weeks later that involves implantation of the cultured cells into the injured area, where they multiply and produce a durable joint surface.

Developed and tested at the university of Gotenborg in Sweden, the new technique and its promising outcomes were first described in the New England Journal of Medicine (10-6-94). The procedure was first performed in the United States in 1995 and Genzyme Corporation began providing the cartilage cell laboratory service to orthopedic surgeons here. Orthopedic surgeons complete special training in order to perform the procedure.

The Medical breakthrough has been performed by **Dr. Saltzman** more than any of the handful of surgeons in the Chicagoland area that are trained in this procedure.

Dr. Saltzman completed his residency in orthopedic surgery at Loyola University Medical Center and is board certified by the American Board of Orthopedic Surgeons and the Arthroscopy Board of North America. He has been in practice since 1984. He currently is at the **Woodfield Orthopedic Center** in Schaumburg, and is on the medical staffs of Columbia Hoffman Estates Medical Center and Alexian Brothers Medical Center.





Independence and Our Freedoms

Happy Independence Day! I have just returned from my son's commencement where I was fortunate to hear Justice Steven Breyer's commencement address. He inspired me to write about independence and particularly our freedoms that are protected by the First Amendment of the Constitution.

"Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof, or abridging the freedom of speech, or of the press; or the right of the people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the Government for a redress of grievances."

The Constitution allows freedom of expression; however, with these freedoms come responsibilities. There has been an age-old conflict between the individual's right to free expression and the government's right to protect itself.

Oliver Wendell Holmes, Supreme Court Justice from 1902-1932, set the tone for determining what constitutes free speech under the Constitution. He stated, "The reason for punishing any act generally must be to prevent some harm which is foreseen as likely to follow that act under the circumstances in which it is done."

You may recall Holmes' famous litmus test concerning the limitation on freedom of expression:

"The most stringent protection of free speech would not protect a man in falsely shouting fire in a theater and causing panic... The question in every case is whether the words used are used in circumstances and are of such a nature as



to create a clear and present danger that they will bring about the substantive evils the Congress has a right to protect."


At the same time, the government has an obligation to ensure that freedom of expression is not unnecessarily squelched. Dr. Holmes warned that "fear of an open discussion implies feebleness of inward conviction, and great sensitiveness to the expression of individual opinion is a mark of weakness."

As we celebrate this Independence Day, let's remember that we are a part of a community... a community of diverse individuals... a democratic community. We were guaranteed freedoms on that first independence day, but the freedoms



Midlife Crises—Myth or Reality

As the baby boomer generation hits the 45 to 55 year old age category, midlife crisis takes on a whole new meaning. Approaching epidemic proportions, most people know someone experiencing a midlife crisis or are touched by it in one way or another. Although it may be easy to conjure up some standard images of midlife; men with graying temples riding Harley Davidson motorcycles with young women in tow or women opting for cosmetic surgery, becoming more assertive, reentering school or the work force after their children are grown or perhaps men or women sliding into a serious depression. When the crisis hits home it is very difficult to understand or deal with for all parties involved.

What is a midlife crisis anyway? It is a time in life, usually in the 40's, when one is forced to deal with a challenging dilemma, disaster or otherwise disturbing issue. Most people engaged in what we know as a midlife crisis seem to be catapulted into this stage by some specific event or situation like the death of a parent, child, friend or sibling, failures in business or financial matters, career loss, affairs or breakup of marriage. It seems that the person going through the crisis takes temporary leave of their senses and needs to go through what they are going through despite the well meaning attempts by outsiders to "help" with reason and logic. The choices one makes during this time are usually not consistent with their usual life patterns. Significant others, family members and co-workers have a challenge ahead of them helping one navigate the rough waters of the midlife crisis. During this time most people begin the phase of "reassessment." People consider what they have done up till now and try to imagine what the future holds. Often faced with aging parents who are becoming more dependent or

experiencing the loss of friends in their peer group puts people face to face with their own mortality. Questioning their current status in life is primary during the midlife crisis.








Barrington Woman A Semifinalist in the Mrs. Illinois/Mrs. America Pageant

Red Oaks in Long Grove, Illinois, will host a special signing event featuring Mr. Janssens of HB Henriot Quimper on Friday and Saturday, July 25 and 26, from 11:00 am to 4:00 pm. Come experience the Provence through the craftsmanship of Quimper pottery. View a video of the 300-year-old handpainting process of the charming French folk pottery inspired by Breton country life. Mr. Janssens will be personally signing Quimper pieces selected that day.

The handpainted French faience known as Quimper (kam-pair) dates back to 1690. The pottery takes its name from the town of Quimper, located in northwestern France, where potter Jean-Baptiste Bousquet built his kilns. Quimper Faience is a fine grain earthenware decorated with an opaque,

tin-based glaze. Each piece of Quimper Faience is completely hand painted without the use of decal or stencil. Signed by the artist and completely painted by one person from start to finish, it reflects the individual touches which makes each piece unique.

During the late 1800's, items featuring sturdy Breton peasants in their traditional garb, men in bragoubraz (baggy pantaloons) and women in long dresses, aprons, and towering headdresses known as coiffes, and elaborate botanical scenes were introduced. Slowly, these are being revived, and today the atelier produces 30 patterns as well as special orders for decors presently not in production. Antique Quimper is sought after by collectors throughout Europe and America.

Ryan Consumer Fraud Bill Gives Senior Citizens Stronger Protection from Scams

Illinois' 1.5 million seniors over age 65 now have a new weapon to protect themselves from scam artists. The General Assembly gave approval this session to Attorney General Jim Ryan's consumer fraud legislation (SB 599) that would impose additional civil penalties of up to \$10,000 against persons violating consumer protection laws against people who are at least 65 years old.

Currently, the Illinois Consumer Fraud and Deceptive Practices Act allows civil penalties of up to \$50,000 per violation. If Ryan's measure is signed into law, the penalty could go up to \$60,000.

"Fraud is big business in this country, taking in over \$100 billion a year, and much of this is aimed at senior citizens," Ryan said. "Telemarketing scams alone take in about \$40 billion annually, and once again, seniors are vulnerable targets. That's why it's so important to find ways to give our aging

population more protection from those who would prey on them."

Fifty percent of the money collected from the penalties would go into an Elderly Victim Fund to be used in investigating and prosecuting fraud committed against the elderly. The other half would be appropriated to the Attorney General to develop and implement statewide education initiatives to inform seniors about how to prevent consumer crimes.

SB 599 was part of Ryan's senior agenda resulting from the Senior Summit he convened last year. Leaders of more than 20 major senior organizations met with him to develop an aggressive agenda for Illinois' senior population, which is sixth-highest in the nation. The summit produced a two-part agenda focusing on an anti-fraud campaign and strengthening the state's response to elder abuse.

the initial visit, ask the dentist about the specific procedures of that appointment so that there are no surprises and you can talk to your child ahead of time about what will occur. You can help to build excitement and understanding this way. It is important to bring with you to the appointment, the child's complete and updated medical history.

Many initial visits are simply an introduction to the office and will last only 15-20 minutes. The child will become acquainted with the dentist, the staff and all of the new sights and sounds that he/she has never experienced before. Short successive visits after this one will build the child's trust in the dentist and the office. It is best to set the appointment up early in the day when the child is most alert and attentive.

During the appointment, the dentist will conduct a complete examination of the teeth, gums, jaws and all oral tissues. This information will be used to monitor growth and development and to observe any potential problem areas early. If indicated, a gentle cleaning will be performed as well as a demonstration on proper home cleaning. We will assess the need for fluoride at this time as it is an important element in the formation of healthy teeth.

Your child's first trip to the dentist should be an enjoyable and relaxing experience that will leave them with a lasting positive impression.




