


It is not always easy to ask for help. Whether we are parents raising children or youth struggling for independence, life can at times be stormy and stressful for everyone. Family problems, poor grades, drug or alcohol abuse, depression or anxiety, running away, isolation from friends and family, misinformation, thoughts of suicide, sexual pressure -- these and other areas of concern exist in numerous families in our communities.

#### **Our Past**

Barrington Youth Services (BYS) is a private, not-for-profit, professionally staffed youth services agency. Founded in 1970, BYS was incorporated in its current form in 1972. Initially a drug abuse prevention program, BYS expanded its services to include not only drug abuse prevention but counseling for a wide variety of youth-related problems. BYS also works closely with a variety of agencies, professionals, schools, police and volunteer groups. BYS has been located in its current office since 1975, and has owned the building it occupies since 1982.

## How We Help

BYS professional staff includes licensed clinical social workers, family therapists, substance abuse counselors, and graduate student interns. In a friendly and caring atmosphere, clients can expect confidentiality and respect for individual dignity.

BYS is licensed by the Illinois Department of Alcoholism and Substance Abuse and staff are board-certified in addictions counseling. BYS retains consultants in child and adolescent psychiatry, clinical psychology and social work.

#### **Our Services**

Counseling - BYS offers a wide array of counseling services to youth and families of the community utilizing individual, family, couples, and group therapy modalities.

Substance Abuse/Dependency - BYS offers chemical use/abuse assessment, ongoing therapy and aftercare support groups under the direction of certified addictions counselors.

CRISIS INTERVENTION & REFERRAL - Through BYS, a 24 hour answering service is available for youth 17 and under and their families.

PREVENTION - One of the hallmarks of BYS over the years is its response to community demands and needs for prevention programming. Prevention programs are designed as a deliberate and constructive process to promote drug education and awareness, stimulate individual growth, build skills or provide support. For parents, they range from parenting training to support in coping with special problems; for youth they range from self-esteem and skill building to grief/loss support.

IMAGES - A cooperative partnership of BYS and park districts from the Villages of Barrington, South Barrington, Barrington Hills and Lake Barrington. Its preventive nature emphasizes a unique combination of recreation, skill building and support for middle school age youth.

**DEFERRED PROSECUTION PROGRAM -** An alternative to prosecution for minors arrested for a violation of ordinances related to possession of drugs or alcohol with an emphasis on education and value clarification.

"The purpose of Barrington Youth Services is to enable youth who are experiencing stress to deal positively with that stress and to enable the community to understand and to address the conditions which contribute to that stress. The focus of the services is on reduction of destructive behaviors, family conflicts, substance abuse, delinquency and school related problems which may arise from family, peer, school, and/or community pressures."

## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Twenty-one years after its incorporation,
Barrington Youth Services continues to assist
youth and their families to build self-confidence,
solve problems, develop coping skills, receive
support, and face a better future than they might
have without BYS input. Methods and
programs vary as needed, but the vitality of this
dynamic agency lies in its aim to provide as
many prevention and intervention programs as
the staff can manage, yet maintain its
professional quality.

Several factors induced changes at the agency. A nationwide trend toward intensity of counseling cases also occurred at BYS, which led to an upgrading of clinical staff qualifications and liability coverage. State licensing requirements for social workers was a key factor in raising the salary range in the profession. Wisely, some salary adjustments were made by BYS to compete for qualified social workers in the marketplace.

The Board has worked hard to fund the many counseling and prevention programs aimed at younger ages, as well as maintaining a building that seems to hum day and evening with client activity. Twenty-two percent of BYS' income for the year was generated by fund raising activities. Additional emphasis was placed on finding additional funding sources by the Board over the past year.

The Board also examined its own needs with the aid of an Executive Service Corps representative. Heavy emphasis was placed on increasing its size and development. Board education and committee restructuring began at a Fall retreat where members reviewed the changes in the BYS responses to prevention trends and community needs.

An increased number of volunteers must not be overlooked. Without their aid, board fund raising activities could not be accomplished. Computer "experts" provided many hours of donated services to implement new programs for recording the agency statistics which are vital to funding requests.

Thank you, all donors of time, talent, services, auction items, money -- for supporting a dedicated BYS board and staff. And, for believing in lending a hand to help someone's child or family over a bump in its road. After all, as one Honorary Advisor said, "Where would the Barrington community be without BYS?"

There is no doubt in my mind. We need BYS and it will be there to adapt and meet the demands and needs of our community.

My second year at Barrington Youth Services has been a year of growth and change, characteristic of a healthy and dynamic agency. Growth within the agency transpired both in number of clients and in number and types of programs offered. Change has occurred through a restructuring of staff to ensure a high level of professionalism and to enable us to better serve our client population.

During FY 1993, 29 percent more people were seen by BYS staff for counseling services than in the past year. Caseloads remain high; for most of the year the agency bordered on a waiting list. A dedicated staff working incredible hours somehow managed to provide for those needing assistance. A part-time counselor and seven talented students were instrumental in the agency's ability to enlarge our capacity to respond to the community's requests.

Due to increased efficiency of BYS staff and facility utilization, cost per staff hour decreased. However, because of increased demand for services, the agency budget is up about 10 percent. Despite hard economic times, we have been provided with the necessary funds to continue quality services.

The generosity of our funding sources is remarkable. Many thanks to the Barrington Area United Way, Cuba and Barrington Townships, the Villages of Barrington, Lake Barrington, and Deer Park who have been fundamental contributors to BYS in this period of dynamic growth. We also depend upon community contributions, fees, and fund raising activities to augment our financial requirements. Many thanks to each of our supporters.



## **PROGRAMS**

Parent education remained a prevention program priority. Seven Systematic Training for Effective Parenting (S.T.E.P.) groups were held for parents of pre-school and elementary school children; one next S.T.E.P. group was conducted for parents who had earlier training.

New loss groups were held in the school by staff, while RAINBOWS loss groups were conducted by volunteers at the agency. An additional facet found parents of children in RAINBOWS groups meeting at the same time in their own group with a BYS counselor.

To meet the expansion in the middle schools, IMAGES program reached out to the sixth through eighth grades at both Barrington Middle Schools as well as St. Anne School.

The Third District Court of Cook County instituted a Deferred Prosecution Program of its own for non-Barrington area residents, modeled after the BYS program. It continues to refer young violators of alcohol and other drug ordinances to the BYS/DPP program.

## STAFF

Rochelle Schulman reorganized staff positions to avoid a waiting list and to meet the increased intensity of cases. Supervision of clinical cases also intensified.

Liz Larsen became assistant clinical supervisor and coordinator of group programs.

Kim Croteau is almost finished with certification for addictions counseling coursework.

Frank Wagner, MSW, joined BYS staff. He brings a unique sensitivity and excellent clinical skills to the agency.

BYS staff refined curriculum for elementary skill building and DPP groups to facilitate more group interaction.

Staff revised statistical report forms to obtain more defined information which reflects new and/or changed programs.

## BOARD

A first all-day Saturday retreat helped in the orientation of a new and expanded Board.

An incredible Board effort raised needed money to fund agency changes. A committee headed by Patti Cross and Becky Zimmerman produced a very exciting Twentieth Anniversary gala, netting nearly \$40,000.

Other projects, individual and organization contributions totalled nearly \$24,000.

Fire and safety requirements of the Illinois Department of Alcoholism and Substance Abuse (DASA) were completed.

Volunteers Jack Boberg, Judith Stone, and Richard Meinhard implemented a new computer system for maintaining and tracking BYS program and service statistics.
