

KILLED AT TARGET PRACTICE

Thirty-three Sailors on United States Battleship-Missouri Die at Their Posts of Duty—Officers' Coolness Saves the Vessel.

In less than five seconds after the explosion every man on the ship was at his fire station. The most that had to be done was to see that it was apparent from the smoke that belched from the turret and handling room that the explosion of powder proportions had occurred.
Capt. on Deck ordered Asst. Ensign Captain Cowles to order the turret's main gun to be fired to flood the handling room and make it safe from the instant it was believed that the next few moments a fatal rattling shot that struck overboard.

Capt. Cowles ordered that in less than five seconds after the first explosion two streams of water were being played in the rooms, and another stream was ordered for every man of the ship responded, and the magazine and handling masts were flooded with water.
Capt. Cowles gave his own commands and but for his presence of mind and the coolness of his officers, the Missouri would have gone down. The second explosion was a rattling shot that struck overboard.

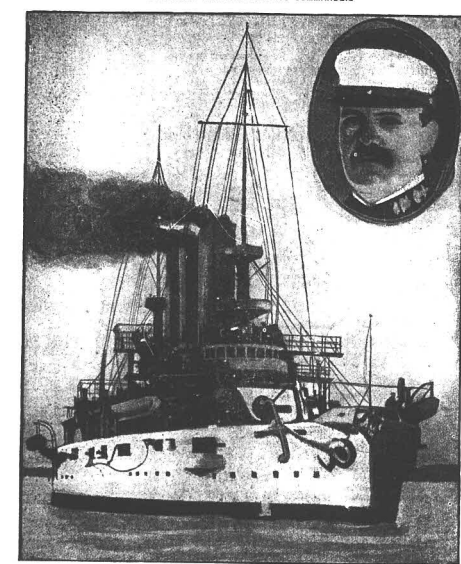
