ILLINOIS CENTRAL TRAIN IS HELD UP

Four Robbers Clean Up Neat Sum on Diamond Special From Chicago.

PASSENGERS THINK IT A JOKE

Bandits Dispel the Mistake When They Make Demands for the Possession of All Articles of Value—One Official Contributes \$100.

Chicago special: Four holdup men, three of them wearing masks and heavily armed, robbed the passengers on the Diamond special of the Illinois Central which left Chicago at 9:27 Monday night. They held up all the passengers in two Pullman sleepers and secured booty estimated at \$100, mostly in money. One young man who resisted was hit over the head with a fire ax, with which the car was supplied, and another who showed a disposition to object was slapped on the head with a revolver.

One man who had already retired to his berth was stirred to animation by the noise and he hid his money. Before making a complete clean-up of the train, the robbers became alarmed, and as the train neared Matteson they pulled emergency brake rope and stopped the train. They then jumped from the train and escaped in the darkness.

Details Carefully Planned. The four men got on the train at Havana, Ill., and immediately took up stations that evidently had been agreed upon beforehand. One stood in the vestibule between the lavatory and the baggage car, another in the rear platform of the last car, which was a Pullman well filled with passengers.

The first thing they did was to pick a quarrel with the bagman and beguile him to the rear end of the train. Once there they got on the train and the four who did not get into the quarrel of death if he made a move of any kind.

The leader of the quartet was unmasked, and was the only one of the four who did not get into the quarrel. The conductor was captured and taken back to the rear platform with the bagman.

COAL PRICES AGAIN ADVANCE

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CORTLEYOU PICKS CAMPAIGN HEADS

Selects Leaders for the Presidential Contest About to Open.

LOOKS TO DOUBTFUL STATES

Workers From New York and Indiana Are Expected to Take Care of Votes and See That They Are Deposited for Party's Choice.

Chicago, Aug. 3.—The names of the men who will conduct the Republican national campaign were made public Tuesday evening. Chairman George B. Cortleyou has selected them and made the announcement just before he left for the West. The four for the executive committee of the national committee had the officers of the latter body. These officers are also expected to be in the West.

Officers national committee—Chairman, George B. Cortleyou, New York; Secretary, Rufus D. Dyer, Ohio; Treasurer, Coradine W. Bliss, New York; Sergeant-at-Arms, William F. Stone, Maryland.

Executive committee—Eastern Division: Charles E. Broderick, Connecticut; N. B. Scott, West Virginia; Franklin Murphy, New Jersey; William L. Ward, New York. Western Division: Chicago: Harry C. New, Indiana; Frank O. Lowden, Illinois; E. B. Schneider, Nebraska; David W. Motwane, Kansas.

James A. Tawney of Minnesota has been named as the speaker, and the bureau for the Western headquarters. He will select the spellbinders for this territory and direct their energies.

Another person may be added to the Western division of the executive committee. If it is done it probably will be either Henry C. Payne of Wisconsin or the national chairman from a far Western state, preferably Idaho or Colorado. There is a difficulty in naming the Wisconsin member, however, to do this would give recognition to one of the two factions in that state, Mr. Payne being a Spooner man, and the national committee desiring to keep out of the trouble.

Honors to Doubtful States. In the main the executive committee is made up of men from what are generally regarded as doubtful states: New York, New Jersey, Connecticut, New York, New Jersey and Illinois by right looked for representation. The appointment of Lowden also is expected to please the faction of the Illinois Republicans who are active in the recent state convention.

Mr. New of Indiana was put at the head of the western branch of the committee, and because his state is the one in the west in which the most active fight is looked for. Col. Lowden was chosen largely because in which it made itself heard, and Chicago and Illinois by right looked for representation. The appointment of Lowden also is expected to please the faction of the Illinois Republicans who are active in the recent state convention.

Fight in the East. It was taken for granted that the makeup of the committee indicated that, in the opinion of Mr. Cortleyou, the main fight will be in the East. The fact that the easterners on it all come from states classed as doubtful was understood, to indicate this. For the past three in the memory of men now active in politics, not in the history of the Republican party, Pennsylvania is not represented in the executive committee, which in older days was always had its committeemen, also is passed by, except that Mr. Dyer is the secretary of the main committee, and as such is officer of the body which will be in the East.

While Mr. Cortleyou is in the east and he expects to spend most of his time in New York or Washington—Secretary Dyer and Mr. New will be in charge of the western headquarters.

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Canadian Homestead Entries

Thirty-one thousand three hundred and eighty-three homestead entries were made in the northwest provinces of Canada in 1903; 64,000 homestead entries have been received in the northwest in the last three years, equal to 10,000,000 acres. The entries for 1903 were double the number for 1902 and as many as for three years previous. These entries mean an addition of \$9,907 to the population.
