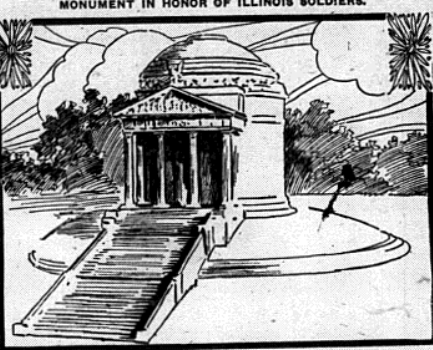
unconscious, apparently, that there could be cause for embarrassment. "Ah! madame," he said, handsome...
