AN ORDINANCE CREATING A BOARD OF LOCAL IMPROVEMENTS.

Be it ordained by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Lake Zurich...

Ordinance No. 13.

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE APPROVAL OF MAPS, PLATS AND SUBDIVISIONS.

Be it ordained by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Lake Zurich...

Section 2. The owner or owners of such land sought to be platted shall cause to be placed in such plat...

Section 3. Whenever land sought to be platted or subdivided within said Village is encumbered by mortgage or otherwise...

Section 4. Whenever a map, plat or subdivision is submitted to them for their approval, not earlier than the next regular meeting after the same shall have been so submitted...

Section 5. Hereafter when the President and Board of Trustees, shall by Ordinance, lay out, locate, open, widen, extend or alter any street, alley or public ground within the Village...

Monuments that the location thereof may be easily ascertained, and said plat shall be recorded in the office of the Recorder of Lake County...

Section 8. This Ordinance shall be in force from and after its passage and approval by the President...

Ordinance No. 14.

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF SIDEWALKS ALONG VARIOUS STREETS IN THE VILLAGE OF LAKE ZURICH, COUNTY OF LAKE AND STATE OF ILLINOIS.

Be it ordained by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Lake Zurich...

Section 1. That all sidewalks which shall be ordered by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Lake Zurich shall be constructed under the superintendence and to the satisfaction of the Committee on Streets and Sidewalks...

Section 2. The inside surface lines of every sidewalk shall be not more than twelve inches from and parallel with the line of the lot along and in front of which the said sidewalk is to be constructed...

Section 3. Whenever the owner or occupant of any lot, piece or parcel of land in and within the Village of Lake Zurich, shall be ordered by the President and Board of Trustees...

Section 4. All sidewalks laid or constructed along or in front of business property shall be of the construction and dimensions herein described...

Section 5. Whenever any sidewalk is constructed along and in front of business property, the material used for the surface of said sidewalk may be laid upon any suitable foundation...

Section 6. All sidewalks which shall be constructed along and upon the following streets shall be six feet in width from the building line...

Section 7. Whenever any sidewalk is constructed along and in front of business property, the material used for the surface of said sidewalk may be laid upon any suitable foundation...

Section 8. The owner of any lot or piece of ground fronting on any sidewalk to be constructed under the provisions of this ordinance shall be allowed forty days after such ordinance is published...

Whenever any such sidewalk shall be constructed by the owner of the lot, piece or parcel of land fronting on said sidewalk, such construction shall be under the superintendence and to the satisfaction of the Committee on Streets and Sidewalks...

Section 5. The grade for sidewalks shall be established by the President and Board of Trustees as soon as practicable where such has not already been done...

Section 6. Whenever any sidewalk or portion thereof is directed to be laid, the President and Board of Trustees shall be given the opportunity to be given to the owners of the property concerned...

Section 7. Whenever the owner or occupant of any lot, piece or parcel of land in and within the Village of Lake Zurich, shall be ordered by the President and Board of Trustees...

Section 8. A bill of the cost of any sidewalk to be constructed to the Village of Lake Zurich, certified by the Chairman of the Committee on Streets and Sidewalks...

Section 9. In case of failure to collect the said special tax in the manner aforesaid, the Village Clerk shall, within one year thereafter, make a report...

Section 10. Whenever any sidewalk is constructed along and in front of business property, the material used for the surface of said sidewalk may be laid upon any suitable foundation...

Section 11. Whenever any sidewalk is constructed under the terms of this Ordinance by the owner of the adjoining lot, then the said Village of Lake Zurich shall pay to such owner a sum equal to one-third of the cost of construction of said sidewalk...

Section 12. Any ordinance heretofore passed by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Lake Zurich relating herewith, or inconsistent with any provisions herein, are hereby repealed.

Whenever the said improvement shall not be made by the said owner, it shall be made by the said Village, and the entire cost thereof shall be fully paid for by special taxation of the lot, piece or parcel of land contiguous to the proposed sidewalk...

Section 12. Any ordinance heretofore passed by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Lake Zurich relating herewith, or inconsistent with any provisions herein, are hereby repealed.
