**PEARY MAKES RECORD**

**ARCTIC EXPLORER NEARER THE POLE THAN RIVAL.**

**DOGS SERVED AS FOOD**

Caches Destroyed by Ice Flies, Compelling Members of Party to Subsist on Such Provisions as Presented Themselves.

New York. — The world's polar exploration record has been broken by Commander Robert E. Peary. The Intrepid American has gone 34 miles nearer the north pole than any man who ever went into the Arctic. Last night Peary reached latitude 87°06', and hints of incredible hardships and dangers are made in a telegram to Herbert L. Bridgman, secretary of the Peary Arctic Club.

**Message follows:**

"Hopedale, Labrador, via Tillamgate, N. E., Nov. 2.—Roosevelt wintered 45 days. Gate disrupted ice destroyed caches, cut off communication with supporting boats and drifted due east. Reached 87 degrees six minutes, north latitude over ice, and it had become necessary. Returning at eight dogs. Drifted eastward delayed by open water, reached north coast Greenland in straightened condition. Killed mask oiled and reloaded. Reached latitude coast to ship. Two supporting parties driven on north coast Greenland. One rescued by me in starving condition, and it had become necessary to Roosevelt sledged west, completing north coast Grant Land and reached other land, near one hundred meridian. Homeward voyage necessary battle on shore. Reached headlands. Roosevelt magnificent ice lighter and sea boat. No deaths or illness on expedition."

**Nansen and Abruzzi Outdo.**

In 1896 Nansen reached 86:14 north latitude, and his exploit was hailed as a tremendous exploit, for that was the farthest north that Greely had gone in 1852. Nansen held the record for only four years. Then in 1900 Capt. Cagni, of the duke of Abruzzi's expedition, pushed his way northward, and after almost incredible hardships reached a point 23 miles farther north than Nansen had done.

Until now the Italian explorer has held the record for farthest north. Now it is his by an American. News from Commander Peary for several weeks, as July 16 was the date he had reached the farthest north of the ice cap surrounding the pole. The commander, when he sailed from New York more than a year ago, fondly hoped that the end of the dash would carry him to the pole itself.

**ABKS INTERNATIONAL HOLIDAY**

Anniversary of Sailing of British Ships from England for Virginia.

Washington.—Secretary Bonaparte has received a letter from Mr. N. Darnell Davis, auditor general of the British Guiana, calling attention to the date of December 19, 1904, as being the first anniversary of the sailing of the *Santa Constant*, Goodspeed and Discovery from Blackwell, England, for Virginia, being the inception of English colonial enterprise of the United States.

Mr. Davis suggests that in commemoration of the event all the vessels of the United States navy, whether at sea or in port, shall "dress ship" on that occasion.

Mr. Davis has already made the suggestion in English newspapers that Great Britain recognize the birth of its "eldest daughter" by a similar action on board their British vessels of war.
