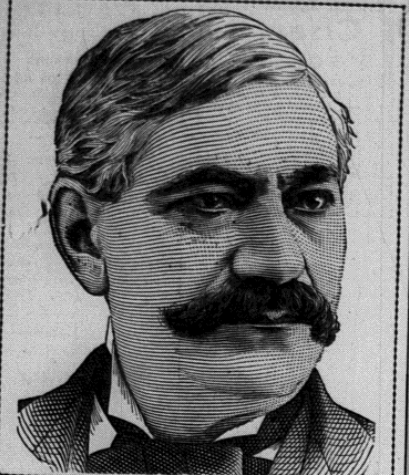

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TREASURE OF ART FOR FRANCE.

Valuable Painting Brought from Italy to the Metropolis.

Theodore Coe arrived from Italy this week, bringing a curious large painting entitled "The Month of Hell," representing monster jaws toward which are drawn human beings in the midst of flames.

It is supposed to be part of an original composition of Matteo da Verona, which served in the decoration of one of the cupolas of St. Mark's. Mr. Coe discovered it at the home of a priest in Venice, who kept it rolled up in a dark corner, not suspecting that he had a work of art of great historical value. He declared a high valuation to the official charged with authorizing the exportation, who said it was too high, and allowed Mr. Coe to take the picture from the country on a lesser valuation.

The trustees at the bureau of exportation in Milan declared he gave the permit simply because the painting was not of great artistic or intrinsic value.—New York Herald.

PRINCESS WOULD WED MARQUIS

Nephew of English King Said to Have Bestowed Love.

Princess Patricia, who is reported to desire to wed the young Marquis of Anglesey, is the third child and second daughter of Prince Arthur, Duke of Connaught, and King Edward of England. Patricia was born in

London, March 17, 1886. Her full name is Victoria Patricia Helen Elizabeth. She made her debut a little over two years ago and is said to be one of the prettiest princesses of the reigning house. Her father is to be credited, she has had many suitors, including King Alfonso, who is to wed her cousin, Princess Ena of Battenberg, and Prince Felix of Saxe-Coburg. Patricia is reported to entertain affection for Lord Anglesey.

China's Empress Woman of Force.

The dowager empress of China has been compared with Elizabeth of England and Catherine of Russia. Her force of character has enabled her to maintain her authority in all the turmoil and intrigue and rebellion which has beset China in recent years. She has absorbed vanity, in which she is like Queen Elizabeth, and a German artist, who has lately painted her portrait, has been describing the experience. The painter made a portrait as true to life as could be, but this was entirely unsatisfactory to the royal patron. She is over 70 years of age, but she wanted a painting of a woman in the full bloom of youth. Her father had to depict her as a woman of 25.
