Sunday school teachers will meet tomorrow evening at the school house.

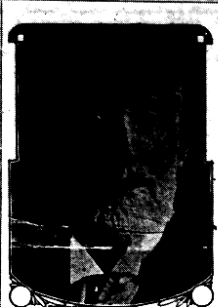
Says Suit is Not Dismissed.

CULLOM PROGRESSIVE SAYS SMITH D. ATKINS

SENATOR AUTHOR OF FIRST STATE LAW FOR REGULATION OF RAILROAD RATES.

I have known Senator Cullom from my boyhood days. I was a student with him at "Old Sandstone," in Mount Morris, the Methodist college of those days, and from that time to this have watched his career with pride. As governor he was in the forefront as a progressive Republican, and is really the author of the railroad and warehouse commission of Illinois, controlling the railroad rates.
