C. S. Castle, 75, Dies at Oak Park; Was Former Resident of Barrington Charles Sumner Castle, former resident of Barrington and great-uncle of the Howard Castle children, died at his home in Oak Park early Monday morning. He was 75 years old. Funeral services were held at his late home Wednesday afternoon and burial took place in Forest Home cemetery. Mr. Castle was born and raised on the Castle farm near Barrington. He founded the Austin State bank in 1895 and in 1910 founded the Standard Trust and Savings bank. He often related how he had obtained the charter, hired officers and clerks, and set up a complete organization at a cost of \$400. He was president of Standard until its consolidation with the National Bank of the Republic in 1928, when he became vice chairman of the executive committee. Later, on consolidation of the Republic bank with the Central Trust company, he retired. At his death Mr. Castle was director of several banks in the Chicago area. Surviving him are his widow, Anna, and four children.

Virgin Islands Include Numerous Small Islands The Virgin group comprises a large number of small islands—only a few of them of any considerable importance—lying to the eastward of Porto Rico between the Caribbean and the Atlantic oceans. They include not only those which the United States bought from Denmark, and which were formerly known as the Danish West Indies, but also a number which constitute a British colony called the Virgin Islands. Columbus discovered the group on his second voyage in 1493. It is said he was amazed at the number of them, and feared he would not have enough saints' names to go round—so he put them under the sacred patronage of the 11,000 martyred virgins of St. Ursula. Danish traders early established themselves on St. Thomas, and by a sort of quarter sovereignty the island was taken under Danish administration in 1671. St. John and St. Croix and smaller islands were added in 1733. The British, meanwhile, appropriated the rest of the group. In 1807-08 the American State department sought to buy the Danish islands. Denmark was willing to sell, and the islanders were eager for the transfer, but the United States senate refused to ratify. In 1902 a second treaty was signed, and the United States went to have the islands for \$2,000,000; but the Danish user house did not ratify. In 1917 the transfer was finally effected, this country paying \$25,000,000.

Salivary Secretion of Swifts Used for Soup Birds' most soup, one of the world's costliest delicacies, is obtainable only at risk of life and limb, says a writer in The Bits Magazine. Most of it comes from Sarawak, where in the vast, gloomy, and haunting limestone caves, studded with stalactites and stalagmites, at the head of the Miah river, the swifts that manufacture this opalescent favelet dwell in thousands amid colonies of bats and cockroaches. The edible birds' nests lie on tiny shelves and ledges, situated in the highest and most inaccessible parts of the caves, and are made of a salivary secretion produced during the nesting season. The actual birds' nesting is performed by Chinese and Malays, who hire the caves from the government for the nesting season at a rental of \$400. These men, fearless and agile, swarm up 100-foot bamboo "ropes," carrying candles in their caps to shed light, and working perilously across the ceiling, doing the nests with a spittle-like stick. As the ground below is soft with guano deposits, the nests are not damaged. The "ropes," made of bamboo rods lashed together, are left standing from season to season, interlacing the caverns like spiders' threads.
