## Scouts Will Hold A National Good Turn Day March 3

Boys Will Collect Old Clothing and Household Goods for Needy

Acting upon a plan from President Roosevelt and under direction of members of the local district committee of the Northwest suburban council of boys, the members of the local scout troops 10, 21 and 29 will participate in the National Good Turn Day on Saturday, March 3.

On this day the scouts will call from house to house in the community to solicit materials for the needy. They will ask those who have to spare household furnishings, blankets, sheets, pillow cases, pillows and quilts; clothing, underwear, stockings, sweaters, aprons, and shoes for women, children and babies.

The local district committee anticipates that many presidents have left a mark in the article and clothes closets things they no longer need. There are many persons who will be glad to get rid of these things.

Each scout troop will be assigned a certain area of the town to cover. Trucks and automobiles will be furnished them to pick up the material. The collections will be delivered to the headquarters of the local relief committee at North High street near North Main street.

This relief committee will supply the needy from the collection.

A list will be made by the boy scout committee of the amount and kind of material collected by each troop, and a report of special collections will be forwarded to President Roosevelt. Persons who have something to give and who are not at home will be contacted by mail, and urged to have a boy scout visit out for articles.
