Illinois Herds to Be Tested for Tuberculosis

Decisions of the Illinois Supreme court have removed obstacles which have delayed the more substantial eradication program in Illinois, the department of agriculture, it was announced today by Director Walter W. McLaughlin, will send inspectors out immediately to continue this important work. Only four of the counties of the state are not accredited under the bovine tuberculosis eradication act.
