Statistics on Tax Collections Made Public by Morse Elia and Cuba townships were listed as the second and third best paying townships on taxes and Barrington ranked third in the list of village taxpayers according to figures made public today by Jay B. Morse, county treasurer. Newport township taxpayers paid 92 per cent of their tax bill, Cuba residents 90.7 and Elia 80.7. By including back taxes collected along with current taxes payable, the percentages were raised considerably, Elia's going to 95 per cent and Cuba's to 94.7. That part of Barrington which is in Lake county paid 86.5 per cent of the current taxes.
