

### Building Survey Reflects Increase in Suburban Area

March Building in Suburban Area Totals \$524,758 in 10 Communities

Substantial increase in building activity in the suburban area of Barrington is reflected in the March building survey. The total value of building in the suburban area for the month of March was \$524,758, an increase of 67 per cent over the same month of last year.

The increase is due to the fact that only five of the 10 communities reported a decrease in building activity. The other five communities reported an increase in building activity.

The communities included in the survey are: Barrington, Fox Lake, Fox Lake Forest, Fox Lake Park, Fox Lake Terrace, Fox Lake Woods, Fox Lake Heights, Fox Lake Lakeside, Fox Lake Lakeshore, and Fox Lake Lakeside.

### Clothing Factory Sees Barrington as Possible Site

Chesterfield Tailors, Employing 75 Workers May Move From Chicago

The Chesterfield Tailors, Inc., employing approximately 75 skilled workers is considering removal of its plant from 484 South Wells street, Chicago, to a suitable building in Barrington.

A plan for assuring the industry for Barrington was revealed at the regular meeting of the Lions club Monday night by W. S. Clark, president of the company and E. J. Gaska, president of the Chamber of Commerce, in explanation talks to the Lions club members. The company is incorporated in Chicago, including \$10,000 in common stock and \$30,000 in preferred (only \$5000 of which has been issued). The sale of the plant is being handled in this community would be a sufficient financial inducement to close the deal.

Representatives of the company investigated several empty buildings in the community but did not express a preference for any one of them over the others.

A committee of four members of the Lions club including Q. R. Paulson, P. R. Drover, Earl M. Schwamm, and J. C. Cadwallader, was appointed Monday night to inspect the Chesterfield Tailors plant in Chicago. The committee reported it to be busy and well equipped.

The Chesterfield Tailors is a custom tailoring concern manufacturing men's suits for mail order sale. It has representatives in cities throughout the United States, and operates several of its own retail stores. Mr. Clark, the president, held an executive position with the Royal Tailors for several years. Both Mr. Clark and Mr. Anderson, secretary of the company, were in Barrington Monday.
