HER Will Remodel High School; Plan \$12,060 Payroll

Relief Labor to Start Work May 21; District to Supply Materials

Relief district No. 4's request for arrangement of relief labor to remodel the local public school building was accepted by the district and the labor will start work May 21, according to Superintendent Smith. An estimated payroll of \$12,060 will be provided by the district but the school will have to supply materials estimated to cost a little over \$100,000.

Plans for remodeling have been advanced and are concentrated on the basement and first two floors. The school officials are planning to take out the old building and replace it with a new one. The new building will be 29 feet 6 inches and 29 feet 6 inches wide. The superintendent will be in charge of the work and will be assisted by the relief labor.
