

To Aid the Blind

There were several systems of reading for the blind in existence before the invention of Braille. The earliest authentic records of the Braille letters for the blind were made by Louis Braille, a Frenchman, in 1809. In 1860 a Spanish man, Valentin Haüy, was the first to employ paper as a means of reading for the blind. At the beginning of the nineteenth century printing was in existence. Well-known types besides Braille were the Moon type, invented by Doctor Haüy in 1817; Fress's and Lucas's.

List New Rates on Electricity to Be Effective June 1

New rates for residential electricity supplied by the Public Service Company of Northern Illinois, ordered by the Illinois Commerce Commission, effective June 1, 1934, are as follows:

6.8 cents per kilowatt hour for the first 7 kilowatt hours used per month in any month.
5 cents per kilowatt-hour for the next 5 kilowatt hours used per month in the month.
4 cents per kilowatt hour for the next 5 kilowatt hours used per month in the month.
3 cents per kilowatt hour for all electricity used in the month in excess of 17 kilowatt hours per month.

The above rates are net. With the low 2 cent rate of the new rate, customers can use nearly one-third more electricity without additional cost, it was reported.
