List New Rates on Electricity to Be Effective June 1st

by the facts presented to the commission, the commission's idea of property values from which the rate base is determined, are, in its opinion, too low and do not give sufficient weight to all the relevant factors bearing on present rates.

"In arriving at the estimated earnings of the company the commission, for rate-making purposes, has excluded some operating expense items claimed by the company as proper and has included certain items not claimed by the company and used by another utility, which the company believes should be omitted from operating expenses. The company believes that these adjustments of earnings, made by the commission, are unwarranted, their effect being to create an apparent ground for a rate cut greater than existing conditions justify.

"Under the Illinois Utility law a temporary order is only a brief stoppage for rate-making purposes and expensive order of hearings, injunctions, and litigation. More than five months have already been consumed in the gathering of testimony, at great expense of time and money to the company, which, under the law is required to bear not only its own entire expense, but also a great part of the expenses incurred by the commission in the course of rate hearings. If this case were taken to the federal court by the company, proceedings it would mean interminable delay, disturbed public relations, and further heavy expenses, to be borne by the owners of the business.

"Notwithstanding the inequities of the commission's findings, the company, desiring it wise to avoid further lengthy and expensive hearings and court proceedings, has decided to accept the rate reductions imposed by the commission, believing that the making of its public statement, the temporary order of final order, and the payment by the company of its expenses by express reservation does not accept the principles upon which the order is based.

"The company staff will thus be relieved from devoting their time and energy to defend our rate structure before the Commission and the Public Hearing Commission will be enabled to address themselves not only to continuation of the high degree of service rendered to its customers and commended on favorably by the commission's order, but to the development and expansion of the consumption of electrical energy and gas in the entire territory served by the company.
