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Police Tickets to Motorists Without 1934 Vehicle Tags
Chief of Police Ernest Baader has started the annual distribution of tickets for automobile owners who have failed to buy large vehicle tags. The May 15 deadline for using last year tags marked the beginning of the annual intensive campaign.
The village trustees in regular session Monday night instructed the police department to make arrests of persons violating the law. The trustees considered several items of business in addition to organization of the board for the new fiscal year. L. S. Storve applied for a permit to build a two-story garage at his property on Division street. The trustees decided that Mr. Storve planned to use his old garage as a chicken house, so refused the application for a garage. He had formerly applied unsuccessfully for a permit to build a chicken house.
A complaint on behalf of owners of property along Station street against numerous violators was filed in the Catlow hall was made by Joe Robertson. Mr. Robertson said that considerable noise was made by crowds at the dances and by the dance orchestras. The complaint was taken under advisement.
A proposed ordinance prohibiting peddling and soliciting in the village was read at the meeting. The ordinance had been prepared by Attorney Maloney on request of some of the local business men, was taken under advisement.

A resolution was offered by Thomas Hays that the village clerk be made a purchasing agent at an additional salary and that all village purchases be made through him in order that there be more systematic purchasing and more equitable distribution of business among local merchants.
