Arlington Heights Wins Conference Meet at Palatine

Arlington Heights scored 55 1/2 points to win the 10th annual Northwest conference track and field meet held at Palatine last Saturday. Libertyville, the defending titleholder, was runner up with 41 points followed by Palatine with 21, Barrington with 15 1/2 and Bensenville with 10. Arlington's strength was in the running events in which it scored 41 of its 55 1/2 points.

Three records were smashed during the day. Eddie Hahnfeldt of Palatine threw the javelin 172 feet 6 1/2 inches erasing the former mark set by Grandy also of Palatine in 1928 by 1 3/4 inches; Rorking of Arlington lowered his half mile record made last year 2.1 seconds to 2 minutes 7.6 seconds, and the Arlington relay team set a new record of 1:37.7 in the 880 yard relay. The former mark of 1:38.4 was also made by Arlington in 1928.

"Hed" Koelling of Arlington won the trophy for the individual scoring the most points by winning three events, the 100 and 230 yard dashes and the broad jump. The Broncho track men scored in nine of the 13 events but most of their places were thirds and fourths. For the local team Drover took third in the 50 and fourth in the 100, Osborn, third in the 880 and fourth in the 440, Calkins, fourth in the mile, Muir, fourth in the shot put and discus, Conn, third in the broad jump, Capull second and Rowland tied for third in the pole vault. The Barrington relay team placed third. This meet was the last of the year for the Broncho thirly club.

Bronchos Defeat Antioch for First Conference Win

The Barrington high baseball team won its first conference victory of the season last Thursday 12 to 11 in a slug fest with the Antioch Indians on the local diamond. An 8 run rally in the last inning when they were seemingly beaten 11 to 4, accounted for the Bronk triumph. In the eventual seventh the local nine scored all eight of its runs with no one out. Willie Altenburg scored the winning run after reaching first on a base on balls.

Coot Belongs to Rall

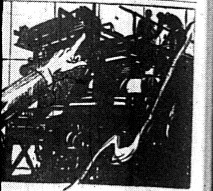

Bill Dreyer of Barrington, running the sixth race of the Ogden Park 10,000 meter race, won the race in record time of 22 minutes and 26 seconds. In leading the field Dreyer ran the first 2 1/2 miles in 30 minutes, breaking the former record of 32 minutes and 52 seconds. Dreyer's record time was set in 1922. The race will meet to be held in the Ogden Park 10,000 meter race on June 15, 1934.
