Mistake in Bookings Results in Greenwood Game; Elgin Here Sunday

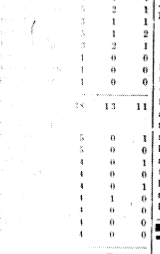

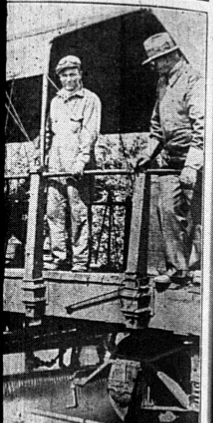
