

Hiking Trails Preserve Trails Becoming a Fad

Hiking trails in the forest preserve district is a new fad, par-taken by individuals, groups, organizations, lodges and associations, a survey reveals.

Each Saturday and Sunday a great influx of hikers hits the trails carrying them through the most interesting areas of the 33,000 acres comprising the forest preserve.

Thousands are seen during the early morning and early evening each day, noting the flight of le-tones in the forest preserve, trails to hit the forest preserve, trails for their health's sake, Charles G. Sauer, general superintendent of the forest preserve district asserts.
