NKA RETARDED RECOVERY

"Instead of a democracy America has during the past ear become a bureaucracy," said Senator Thomas D. Schall, of Minnesota, today.

"Please note," he continued, "that the NRA and its alphabetical cousin, the AAA, went into effect in July 1933. The first industrial code, cotton textile, was approved by the president July 9. Please remember July as the starting point from which to measure the economic effect of the NRA and its crackdown brigadier. Yet from July to December, the first six months of the NRA, only one industrial country on the globe had a set-back in industrial production, and that on the globe had a set-back in industrial production, and raw was the United States. And from July to December the in-dustrial production of the United States dropped 25 per cent, the heaviest decline for that period of the year in the entire history of the depression, which began in 1929. The low point of the depression was in July 1932. Recovery then began. There was therefore dur-ing the fall of 1932 and the early winter of 1933 no longer 'an emergency' such as to justify a dictatorship by the sus-pension of the laws and constitution of the United States."

The present program involves approximately 300 grade separations in most of the counties of the state. These grade separations will result in material reduction of serious and fatal accidents over a period of time.

Years will be required to pay even a considerable part of it, and the money will come out of incomes and out of business in accordance with the tax systems now in effect or later enacted.
