Welsh Name With 58 Letters

For more than half a century an abbreviated form of the name of the Anglesy village Llanfairpwllgwyngyllgogerychwyrndrobwllllantysilioeglwys has been used at the railway station on the London-Holyhead line, on the L. M. and S. railway, but now the full name is blazoned on a placard 25 feet long. This is understood to be in honor of the visit of Prince George to the residence of Lord Anglesey. The name is commonly shortened to Llanfairpwllgwyngyll, meaning "the Church of St. Mary by the white hazel pool"; to Llanfair P. G., and even to Llanfair. The full name contains 58 letters and 119 syllables.—London Times.

Inquest in Death at Beverly Lake Postponed a Week

Man Who Died While Swimming Not a Victim of Drowning

An inquest into the death of Peter Ligman who died while swimming in Beverly lake on Higgins road near the southwest corner of Barrington townships, was held at 203 S. Cook street Wednesday but was continued until July 25 after reports indicated that an examination of the body had given no sign of death having been caused by drowning or heart trouble. Vital organs have been sent away for laboratory tests it was reported.

Mr. Ligman and two companions Alex. Harnack and Walter Chacko, all from Chicago, had motored to Beverly lake. Harnack and Chacko had taken a boat and rowed out about 300 feet on Beverly lake, when Mr. Ligman took off his clothes and went into the water and started to swim to shore. After he had swum about 200 feet he called for help. His friends thought he was joking since he was in shallow water about three feet deep, but they went to his aid and brought him to shore. Efforts of Elgin and Dundee firemen and a first aid squad from the Public Service company of Northwestern Illinois failed to revive him and the body was brought to 203 S. Cook street, Barrington.

Mr. Ligman was 38 years old, a World War veteran, an former proprietor of a tavern in Cook county. He lived at 840 N. Holt street, Chicago. His widow and one child survive him.
