**First Use of Milk Bottles**

**Sugar Produced by Nicotine**  
Because sugar is produced by nicotine, scientists assert they have found the reason why smoking seems to appease the appetite of a hungry man. Hunger appears from our observations and those of other investigators to arise within a definite time after the blood sugar falls to the fasting level. 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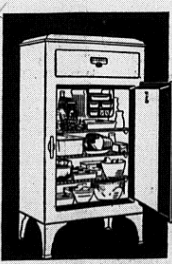
