

Feathered Saluki Enjoys Greatest Honor in Persia

Throughout the lonely desert stretches of Persia, the feathered (Sham) Saluki, still enjoys the high esteem his ancestors earned in the song, art and verse of the sport-hungry khans of 6000 B. C. Not treated as the despised dog of the Arab, speak of him as the noblest, most honored of his possessor with the title "gentleman." He receives thoughtful care, stretching himself on the carpet of his master's tent.

With the exception of his long silk ears that reach the corners of his mouth and feathered tail, the Saluki at first glance resembles the modern greyhound. He is, however, lighter in build and shorter, with a straight back, presenting in profile almost a perfect square. His extremities and under-body colors are of pale shades than his short, close body coat, which may be golden cream, white, fawn, black, black-brown, blue or silver gray.

He is not to be confused with other oriental greyhounds such as the Pariah (Afghan) hounds that are larger and heavier and of shaggy appearance, featured their entire body with the exception of their tail, almost all of feather and carried like a sheaf. Both these breeds are said to be capable of great endurance and speed, being credited with a speed of 32 yards per second in spite of the handicap of loose sand. Of faithful and gentle dispositions, either is always a valuable companion.—Los Angeles Times.

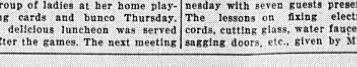

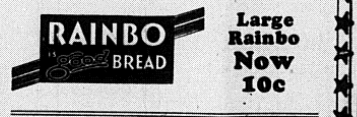
