Two Die in Auto Crash at Palatine Tuesday; 4 Injured

Cook County Motor Toll Now 714 for 1934; Inquest Held Thursday

Two motorists were killed and four injured in a collision at Palatine Tuesday evening which cost the lives of Mrs. Meta Hildebrand, 35 years old, and Herman Berlin, 33, both of North Plum Grove avenue. Palatine, Mrs. Hildebrand died outright and Mr. Berlin died a half hour later in Palatine hospital. The tragedy was witnessed by Mrs. Hildebrand's husband, who was standing on the sidewalk near a highway stand operated by his brother, Walter. He had left the automobile just five minutes before to visit with his brother.
