### Plan for Subsistence Farming Proposed by N. T. Maxon, Architect

During the height of the depression, one of the leading editors of farm and live stock publications, went to Washington to do what he could to relieve the large farmers and the unemployed. After his visit there he returned to his desk and asked all his readers to send in suggestions of a complete plan to help solve the situation.

Under the Maxon plan the workers are to build their own homes and other home structures. This is done by having pre-fabricated units built that will be adaptable for any type home the worker may select. All buildings would have these typical building units, yet at the same time be different in appearance when completed. The worker does not need to have any previous building experience, as all assembly of the units will be under a competent supervisor.

These homes will have every modern convenience. Hot air heating plant that will act as an air conditioning plant as well as a heating plant will be the only air conditioning plants will be built. In the north a combined plant with special Thermo glass will be standard construction. The cost of a five room house will under this system cost approximately \$500 per room or \$2,500 the land not to exceed \$125 per acre. This the owner pays out under the insurance plan in 10 years.

### July Figures Show Marked Increase in Suburban Area

Building Permits for Last Month Total \$435,510 for This Region

Suburban building figures in the Chicago region for the month of July showed a decided increase over last month, villages adjacent to Barrington as well as Barrington itself having started several new projects. Barrington shows a total of \$12,765 in building permits issued last month as compared with \$1060 in June, 1934. Last month in July, 1932, Barrington's total for the Chicago suburban region, \$435,510, was favorably with January's \$450,000 and May's \$491,000. February was able to show only half of July's total, but several other months exceeded July's figures, March with \$524,000, April with \$530,000 and June with \$620,000.
