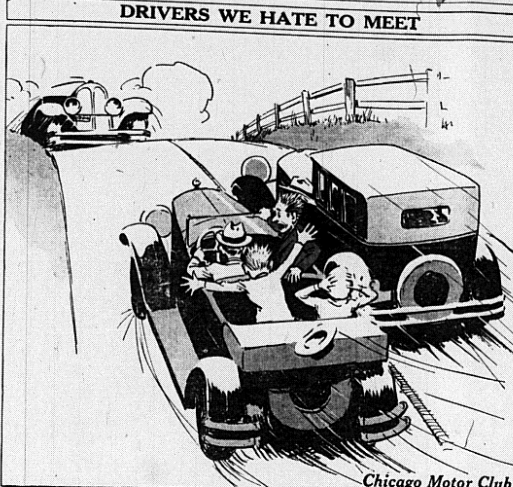

This will be the last match in which Lewis will engage before his world's championship contest in Chicago, on the night of September 29, against Jim London.

Besides this great attraction, manager Les White has signed a host of other world's title contenders for his preliminary matches. Jim McMillen will get a chance to redeem himself for his defeat at the hands of Lou Plummer on the last Round Lake card, when he meets "Crybaby" George Zaharias, the Colorado Greek in the semi-windup.
