## Jewel Will Pay Employees in Old Fashioned Iron Men Friday: Plan to Test Local Money Circulation

Coin collectors are going to have a regular field day in Barrington, as the result of several thousand silver dollars which will go into circulation Friday. The occasion is a "how of money" test which Jewel has long and how rapidly a sum of money will circulate in this community when started from the same point. The power and usefulness of money depends upon the number of people who use the same dollar in any given period. The company released more than 5000 silver dollars as a portion of the weekly payroll to its plant and office force. Since Jewel has been in Barrington more than 20 years, it has been paid to its local employees in salaries but this is the first time that any effort has been made to determine what happens to the money or how long it remains an indelogue in the community.
