Restore Wild Life
Back in 1912 a volcanic eruption on Kodiak island in Alaska wiped out all wild animals with the exception of bears, and since that time the bears have been the lone wild inhabitants of the island. To restore the wild life and to provide employment and future game for the inhabitants, the government, through a civil works allotment, has repopulated the island, at least prepared the groundwork for a real population. A number of Indians, working under unemployed guides, captured 500 animals, principally deer, marion and snowshoe rabbits. These were released principally on Kodiak, although other islands were also given small numbers of the animals.
