The Cook county vote from Barrington and Palatine townships as listed above is limited to republican and democratic returns to save space. However, there were four additional tickets listed on the ballots including national progressive, prohibition, socialist labor, and socialist. But the combined vote cast for these four minor parties amounted to less than 2 per cent of the total votes cast at the polls.

For example in Barrington precinct 3 where Stratton received 309 votes and Stelle 106 votes, Venecok for treasurer on the national progressive ticket received only 1 vote, Regan on the prohibition ticket received 4 votes, and Franklin on the socialist ticket received 2 votes. None of the minor parties except the prohibition party had any county candidates listed on the ballots. The socialist ticket went only in Palatine precinct 1 than any minor party ticket did in any other precinct with from 5 to 7 votes for each candidate.
