Kim Farm Raiser will be known hereafter as an advanced register sire. Only Guernseys which meet high production requirements are eligible for entry. The two daughters which have credited official records are Sunnymede Beauty Spot 841978 producing 3427.4 pounds of milk and 62.1 pounds of fat in class 7:11 and Sunnymede Beauty Huzook 841979 producing 3533.1 pounds of milk and 44.4 pounds of fat in class 8:11.
