Naming Bermuda Parishes In 1618 Richard Knaxwood, English surveyor for the then Bermuda Co., divided the island of Bermuda into eight tracts or parishes. Eight of the largest stockholders were assigned a parish, which was in accordance to custom to bear the name of the owner. Bermuda continued the original parish names, which persist on that island. The parishes were named after the margrave of Hamilton; Smith after Sir Thomas Smith; Carver after the earl of Carver; Pagan after Lord Pagan; Southampton after the earl of Southampton; Mount after Sir Robert Mount; who later sold his share to the earl of Warwick, when the name was changed to Warwick; Sandy's after Sir Edwin Sande.

Author of Bay's Arithmetic Joseph Bay, educator, was born in Virginia in 1807. His early education was self-obtained. He began to teach school at age 16. He subsequently he studied at Washington College in Pennsylvania, and at the school which is now Ohio Wesleyan University. He obtained the degree of M. D. at the Ohio Medical College, and was for a time a surgeon in the Cincinnati hospital. From 1834 to 1851 Doctor Bay taught mathematics at Woodward College in Cincinnati, and when it was converted into a public high school he became its principal. During this time he published his series of books on arithmetic and algebra. From about 1852 he was president of the board of directors of the Cincinnati House of Refuge. He died in Cincinnati in 1865.
