Barrington Bronks and Ponies Win in Contests With Ela

The Ela high school basketball team has not been practicing since the beginning of the school year was reported in the review last week. The team at Lake Zurich have been practicing only for a few weeks but the two afternoon practices according to reports from the school.

Barrington Bronchos took their conference game rather easily against Ela team 31 to 12 last night at the local gym. They inaugurated this year's conference honors which will be with another championship game at the end of the season. The Ponies won their first game in season in a preliminary contest defeating the Ela Lights 20 to 17.

The Bronks overwhelmed Ela in their first quarter to make the game nothing at the end of the period.

They, however, outscored the Bronks in the second quarter, making the score 12 to six in the Bronks' favor at half time.

In the third quarter, the Bronks again pulled way ahead, making the score 19 to six. The Bronks then scored heavily in the fourth quarter and chalked up their final score of 31 to 12.

Although Ela's zone defense was fairly effective on the small court, Ela's had no trouble sinking five field goals and one throw to lead the scoring with 11 points. Conn and Laits made eight points to account for most of the other local score.

In the game between the Ponies and Ela Lights, neither team played an outstanding game. However, Ponies had the edge in play, took the game 20 to 17.

With about a minute to play in the fourth quarter, Ela started to score some field goals, but the run ended its chance to defeat the local.
