

# Barrington High Cagers Take Holidays Seriously; Lose Two More

## Leyden Is Victor of Quadrangular Vacation Tourney

### Bronchos Lose to Arlington and Palatine; Leyden Wins Two Tilts

The Leyden Eagles of Franklin Park smashed their way to victory in the Christmas basketball tournament between Arlington, Palatine, Leyden and Barrington Tuesday and Wednesday, December 23 and 24.

Barrington lost to Arlington in the first game Tuesday night by a 26 to 22 score. Leyden took the second game of the evening from Palatine in a fast game that ended with a 22 to 14 score.

Wednesday night the losers of Tuesday's games, Barrington and Palatine, played the first game which ended in a 22 to 18 score in favor of Palatine. The winners of the previous games, Leyden and Arlington, played the final game of the tourney which resulted in Leyden's 24 to 19 victory over the opponents.

The Bronchos opened the scoring on free throws and led the game for the first quarter. Arlington slowly pulled away from the Bronchos in the second period to lead the score 13 to 13 at the half. Barrington again took the lead in the third period until a minute of playing time was left and a Cardinal opened up with a nice open field goal making the tally Arlington 15, Barrington 17. The Bronchos kept a close tab on the Cards for the last quarter trailing most of the period and were only four points behind as the final gun made the score 24 to 22.

### Shooting Percentage Low

The Bronchos percentage was a new low for them. Barrington worked in plenty of shots in this game, but scored only ten per cent of them. The Bronchos, however, had an edge over the Cardinals in charity throws scoring 14 to Cards eight. Grabenkort was high point man for the locals sinking seven free throws and one field goal. High scorer for Arlington was Pingel with three field goals and three charity tosses.

### Leyden Defeats Palatine

Leyden found tough competition by the Palatine Pirates and trailed most of the first half. Leyden was behind at the half 11 to 12. The Eagles literally walked away from the Pirates in the third quarter and continued opening the gap until the final gun ended the game 22 to 14.

The Bronchos-Pirate game seemed the first half and ended with a fall score. Palatine pulled away from the Bronchos with not much of a margin which was narrowed as the fourth period closed. The Bronchos ran their shot percentage a little over the previous ten per cent.

### Leyden Victorious

The Arlington Cardinals led the score for the first half by a close margin. Leyden picked up a 4-point lead on the Cards, but lost it right away, then tied the score 12 all on a free throw. Leyden lagged again with a 17-15 tally. The Eagles then closed in to end the game with a score of 22 to 19.

### Red Faber to Head State Tournament at Elgin July 20

Urban "Red" Faber will act as director of the 1937 Second Annual Illinois State championship semi-pro baseball tournament to be held in Elgin July 20 to August 5. This announcement was made Wednesday by state commissioner A. R. Dahn. The veteran White Sox pitcher will have complete charge of the competition in the state tournament. He will draw up the schedule, have charge of the umpires, rule on any protests and will personally supervise the play of every game of the championship meet.

Faber is only one of the former major league "greats" who are getting back into baseball through the efforts of the national baseball congress. Hans Wagner will again act as commissioner in chief. Last year Wagner visited most of the state tournaments including the one at Elgin. He will be assisted this year in various states by Trip Speaker, Ty Cobb, Walter Johnson, and Fred Clark.

According to the Commissioner Dahn, the tournament program will differ somewhat from the 1936 tourney. This year the state will be divided into 16 or more districts, with a tournament in each district. Only district champions will be allowed to compete in the state championship tournament in Elgin. There will also be a district tournament held in Elgin which will open in June. A complete list of district tournament sites will be announced by March 1.

The first annual semi-pro baseball tournament was held in Elgin in July, 1926. It was won by the Elgin Semi-Pro club in 1926.
