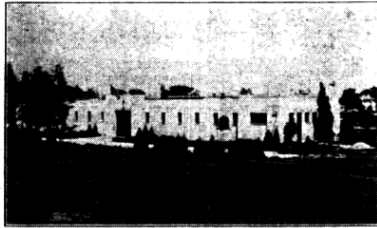


## Prepare Barrington Parks for Coming Summer Season

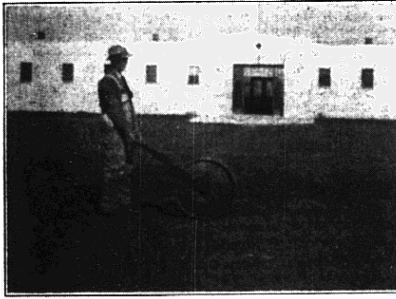
Nature has again spread her handiwork in Barrington's two parks, making them a welcome playground for hosts of children and adults this summer. Preparations for the start of the summer season are going on in Northside park and the Russell street playground.

No program of extensive planting is being undertaken this year



in either park. Last year considerable improvements were made under a program instituted by the Garden club of Barrington. Henry Melow, park superintendent, reported little is being done, with the exception of transplanting some shrubs.

Installation of tennis and croquet courts has been delayed by the



lack of funds, park officials reported. Locations for the courts are laid out but until sufficient revenue is available, nothing will be done.

The swimming pool in Northside park will be opened on May 28, if weather permits. The rural and village school play day will be held in Northside park

on the 28th and the pool is being put into readiness for opening. If it is warm enough.
