## Varsity Track Men Lose Dual Meet to Palatine Squad

Northwest Conference Meet to Be Held at Palatine Friday

BHS varsity track men were taken into camp in the dual meet with Palatine by a score of 63 to 59 Monday afternoon. This meet, formerly slated for last Friday, was carried over to Monday because of inclement weather.  
The Broncos were kept from taking the meet by only four points and with another first place could have won. Six of the local squad scored first places and five men captured seconds. Cadwallader, who has been walking away with the shot put honors for the Bronks, was in good shape putting the pill 45 feet and two inches. Kuhn, of Palatine, walked off with first place in the 100 and 220 yard dashes and the 440 yard run.

**Conference Meet**  
Local track men will travel to Palatine to participate in the annual conference track and field meet that is to be held Friday afternoon. The record of the local team thus far puts them on the spot as far as scoring is concerned. However, Cadwallader and Grabenkort are two good possibilities

for earning points. Cadwallader has been putting the shot out so that by Friday 45 feet should look fairly easy. Grabenkort has been topping 18 feet all season in the broad jump and has hit 19 feet at Palatine once before.

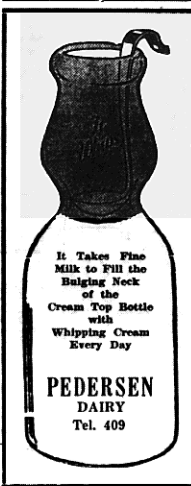

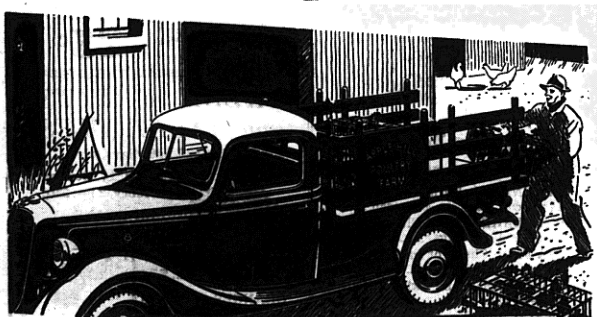
