tour, Ill. Sunday, where they visited the St. Peter Episcopal church.

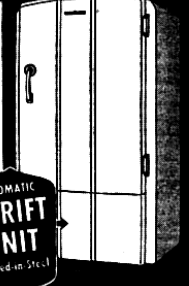
Robert Zimmerman, who won the American Legion contest, returned Saturday after having spent a week at a boys' camp.
