

Bears Play Arlington in District Quarter-Finals at Elgin Tonight

5 Teams Remain in Race; Take 9-7 Contest Monday

Winner of Tonight's Contest Plays Friday Night in Semi-Finals

Spotting the Sycamore Anacondas five runs in the first two innings, the Barrington Bears came back and won the game 9 to 7 Monday night in the district tournament at Elgin for the right to enter the quarter-finals. Winner of the district meet will play for the state title at Elgin during July.

Five teams are left in the district. They are Barrington, Dundee, St. Charles, Arlington Heights and the Elgin West Ends. The West Ends are the only undefeated team in the list.

Dundee was to meet St. Charles last night, Wednesday, with one team being eliminated. Arlington defeated Plato Center Tuesday night and meets the Bears tonight, Thursday, with the winners playing in the semi-finals with the winner of Wednesday's contest.

Monday night the Bears started poorly with R. Stickle's walking three men and giving up two hits for three runs. The game was scored by Sycamore in the second.

The Bears broke into the runs column on a homer by George Kowalski in the third. They pushed three more across in the fourth and two in the fifth to tie the score at six-all. Sycamore scored one in the fifth.

The Bears came back and scored three runs in the sixth to lead 9 to 6. In the last inning, the game was called after seven innings by agreement of the managers. Sycamore filled the bases on walks and errors but only scored one run when they were cut off by a fast double play by George to Reese.

The game started at 11 o'clock Monday night and finished at 1:03 o'clock Tuesday morning. The late hour was caused by the delay in the first game starting, Arlington Heights and Roselle not going on the field until 8:30.

The Bears must win two hard ball games to earn the right to play the Elgin West Ends for the championship Sunday afternoon. The team at present is well-balanced, and has a number of good hitters. Prospects for winning the title are excellent.

Arlington Heights will be the tougher of the two opponents and the game tonight should be a scrappy battle. A large number of local fans have been making the trip to Elgin to follow the team, and interest in tonight's game is high.

Bruns and Shikina Open Wrestling at Round Lake July 9

Ok! Shikina, internationally famous Japanese heavyweight wrestling champion, has been selected to oppose young Bob Bruns, 218 pound sensational world title threat, in the first all-star professional wrestling card of the current summer season to be staged in the Round Lake Haunted House open-air arena under the stars Friday night, July 9.

Brun, who has just returned from a six month campaign throughout the eastern states where he has become the greatest box office attraction since Jim London, has been trying to force Jim McMillen into a return match at Round Lake to square a "false" loss he suffered at the hands of "Big Jim" last summer in the same arena. McMillen, however, apparently has no intentions of risking his reputation in another bout with the powerful and spectacular Bruns, and refuses to tangle with Bob.

Promoter Fred Kohler and Matchmaker Les White, who have combined in bringing the nation's leading heavyweight and light-heavyweight stars to the Round Lake bowl this summer, have promised Bruns a chance at McMillen if he can get past Shikina. No other matches for the first card have been closed as yet, but Frankie Talaber, former amateur star and undefeated as a pro, has signed articles to wrestle in the semi-windup in one of the two matches on this card to be battled in the first round of the Northern Illinois section of the nationwide light-heavyweight tournament now in progress to determine an official world's champion in this class. It is planned that the winners of these two bouts will move along in the sectional tournaments and the top men in each vicinity will finally meet for the national and international world's championship.

Demonstrate Farm Terracing Friday

A demonstration of terrace building as a part of the soil conservation program will be held at the Corlies Anderson farm, north of route 58, Golf road, four miles east of Elgin, on Friday afternoon at 2:30. The program has been arranged by O. G. Barrett, Cook county farm adviser.

Ralph C. Hay, an extension specialist of the University of Illinois, will assist in conducting the demonstration. Friday, Mr. Barrett, in outlining the demonstration, said: "Terraces properly built are good insurance not only against further heavy losses of soil but also for the successful start of a lime and legume program. They minimize the danger of having expensive fertilizers and seed washed away by heavy rains. Terracing is not a substitute for good soil conservation practice; it supplements soil conservation measures by providing for protection."

Post Office Ceases to Issue S.S. Cards

With the close of business June 30, the post office department ceased to issue social security account cards. It was announced at the local post office today. Beginning today, account numbers will be issued through field offices of the social security board, and applicants must mail their applications direct to such field offices, postage prepaid. The office for this territory is located at 173 W. Madison street, Chicago. The local post office will maintain a supply of the treasury department forms SS-4, employer's application, and SS-5, employee's application, together with instruction circulars to be handed to employers or employees on request, and will continue to assist in every way practicable with information necessary to complete these forms.
