 15 cents, road and bridge 25 cents, or an increase in the 1937 school of 38 cents. This increase in part can be explained by the addition of 30 cents for poor relief, a new

Item of expense last year. Other comparisons show the village rate increased six cents, the park rate 20 cents and school district No. 4 8 cents. The only reduction in the basic rate was made by the town of Barrington when 3 cents was cut from the general support tax fund.
