

Barrington Bears Eliminated From State Baseball Tournament

Take 5-1 Beating From Seahorses in Contest at Elgin

Loss Sunday Kills Locals' Chances; to Resume League Play

The Barrington Bears were eliminated from the state championship baseball tournament at Elgin Sunday night when the Waukegan Seahawks administered their second defeat. The score was 5 to 1. The first loss was also given by a Lake county nine, the North Chicago Stanzas.

The Seahawks scored their five runs on seven hits and two walks. A double by Peterson, Seahorse first baseman, a triple by Baker, Seahorse short stop, and a home run by Guy, Seahorse right fielder, were damaging blows that sent home the runs. Wilson was on the mound for Barrington and was in trouble at the start when two runs were scored. Guy's home run in the seventh was an aboard peg that cost the contest on ice.

Stan Hubley hurried for the Seahawks and tied up the Bears, allowing three hits during the first inning. Hubley left fielder, was the only batter to connect with Hubley's offerings for extra bases. Murphy and Wilson garnered the other two hits.

The Bears wound up the tournament play with two wins and two losses. They defeated the Aurora All Stars in the first game, then lost to the North Chicago Stanzas. They copped their second win by trouncing Bloomington.

The locals earned the right to enter the state meet by placing second to Elgin West Ends in the district meet held last month. Play will now be resumed in the Tri-County league, Manager C. Liposky reported.

There were over 70 teams in this contest. The team was composed of James and Donald Weber, and Roy Anderson, with Howard Heidemann alternate.

Professor Leo Somers and R. R. Parks of the University of Illinois conducted an irrigation tour in cooperation with the Boone county, McHenry county, and Lake county farm bureaus on July 27. Leo Baker's place was visited. In 1936 he watered his potatoes twice with a seep hose made of double-filled canvas treated with asbestos. His yield on late potatoes was 300 bushels per acre in 1936 while his early potatoes yielded 200 bushels per acre.

In the afternoon Marshall Bros. 60 acre potato field was visited at Belvidere. They have a pump running continually which turns out on this 60 acre field about 24,000 barrels of water per day, or as much water as the entire city of Belvidere uses per day. They are using the open ditch system.

It takes about seven days to water the 60 acres of potatoes, and it is watered about four times a season. They have a fall of 2 1/2 inches per hundred feet. Last year they harvested 400 bushels of potatoes per acre. This is the largest irrigation project in the middle west.
