Three men were cut and bruised in a three-car collision on route 60 north of Wauconda Sunday afternoon. Edwin Kappes, 2143 N. Tripp avenue, Chicago, accompanied by his wife, was driving south on route 60 when his car swerved an automobile driven by C. C. Carlson, 2517 W. Sixty-first street, Chicago.
The Kappes car then collided with a car driven by Frank Semple, 355 Oak street, Elmhurst. Kappes, Semple and John Kampe, 500 Foster avenue, Chicago, were treated for cuts and bruises at the Wauconda emergency hospital.

Cars Crash Head-On; Three Are Injured

When the driver of a south-bound car became confused on the turn on U. S. route 12, a mile north of Palatine, Saturday night, three persons were severely injured as their machine crashed head-on into another at that point.
John Gould, 5833 Rice street, Chicago, driver of the car; Ray Gould, father of the driver, and Miss Vanetta Overstreet, 1001 Parkside avenue, Chicago, were the three injured. Gould's car crashed into one driven by John Koleci, 1737 Potomac avenue, Chicago. Neither Koleci nor his five passengers were injured.
The Gould persons were enroute Chicago following a picnic at Fox River Grove Saturday. When they approached the point north of Palatine where the road swings to the east, the driver became confused, starting to make the turn and then straightening out. The old route leaves the main highway at that intersection and continues into Palatine.
Koleci had stopped for the stop sign and when Gould swung his car back into that lane, the machines crashed head-on.
The injured were taken by ambulance to the Palatine Community hospital where it was learned Miss Overstreet suffered three deep lacerations on the head. Both Goulds suffered chest injuries and shock.

Mr. and Mrs. Robert Wilson, 2137 Douglas boulevard, Chicago, were injured about the head when their machine tipped over on Northwest highway near Cuba Monday afternoon. It had skidded and rolled over when Mr. Wilson attempted to bring it back on the pavement.
Mrs. Wilson received a deep laceration on the head and also on one hand. Her husband also was cut about the head as well as receiving numerous bruises.
The Wilsons were enroute to Lake Geneva, Wis., for a vacation and were driving a new car with slightly over 600 miles on the speedometer. The machine was reduced to junk.
