Soil Conservation

The 1938 agricultural conservation program was launched at Antioch township high school in Lake county Wednesday at the first of a series of community meetings.

In addition to making a study of background material and objectives of the new conservation program, those present elected community committeemen to administer the program in their localities.

Dates and places of other community meetings in Lake county are as follows: November 12, at 8 p. m., Newport, Benton, Warren, and Waukegan, at the Starford school; November 15, 8 p. m., Elia and Cuba at the Elia town hall; November 17 at 8 p. m., Fremont and Wauconda at Wauconda town hall; November 22 at 8 p. m., Vernon, Deerfield, Shields, Libertyville at Hawthorne school.

Farm Adviser H. C. Gilkerson, Chester A. Faulkner and Vincent M. Casey are in charge of the community meetings.

When farm production is excessive and crop surpluses pile up, farm income goes down, it was explained. Farmers then are unable to buy as many city-made goods, business in general slows down and unemployment in the cities follows.

This unemployment means lack of buying power for farm products, and prices received by farmers and farm in-

comes are pushed farther down. Friends of agriculture believe. Under the pinch of low income, farmers in the past have been forced to overcrop their soil by keeping every possible acre in cash crops which deplete the soil and subject it to erosion.
