Crystal Lake to Meet Bronchos in Practice Contest

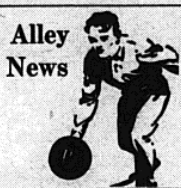

Bals Pollinate Bananas
Bals play the role of bees in pollinating certain kinds of bananas, states Dr. L. van der Pijl, biologist of the Netherlands East Indies. Certain species of these flying mammals have very long tongues, equipped to collect pollen for food. They move from flower to flower, and in so doing transfer enough of the pollen surplus to effect fertilization. The banana flowers visited by the bats have an odor quite disagreeable to human nostrils, which is said to be quite like that of the bats themselves, and hence presumably attractive to them.
